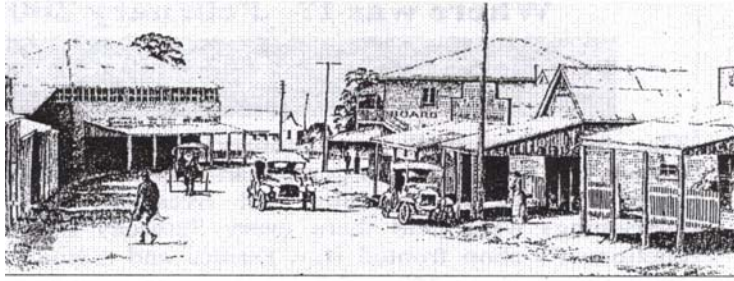

## FROM THE PRESIDENT



It is September and Spring is here. The days will be getting longer and warmer. At the last meeting I put forward the idea that it might be a good idea to start earlier at 7pm during Winter. However a number of people approached myself and the Committee indicating that they would prefer the meetings to stay at 7.30pm. So it will remain at this time. We will make sure in the future that we stick to time limits so that we finish on time. Thanks for your comments. While I am mentioning meetings I would once again like to thank the people rostered for supper. These members put a lot of work into preparing delicious snacks and drinks. You are appreciated.

In the coming weeks you will no doubt hear about the "Wynnum Central Cup Day". The event is being promoted by the Wynnum Chamber of Commerce and will be held in the grounds of Wynnum Central State School on Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> October from 10am – 2pm. The event is being advertised as part of the Wynnum Spring Festival. It also celebrates the history of Wynnum Central State School which is to close at the end of 2010. At 11am on the day there will be a guided historic tour of the school. The tour will finish at the School's performance space at 11.30am, where I will present a shortened version of last year's play, "Echoes from the Past" which includes a new segment on Wynnum Central State School. For this performance I have been helped by our Librarian Jill Greenhill, the "Writers of Wynnum" and the Wynnum Manly Arts Council. At the end of the performance, which should take about 45 minutes, I will be attending the Wynnum Spring Festival in Bandstand Park where the Wynnum Manly Historical Society will have a display and information stall.

Following on from our Oral History Workshop with Dr. Helen Klaebe and Lena Volkova, we have had a further meeting. The meeting was held in the "Merv Beitz Room" of the Wynnum Library with Kate Harbison, the local historical librarian, Jill Greenhill WMHS librarian, Noela Stratton, Myrtle Beitz, Anne Hall and myself. Our objective was to develop an Oral History project which will benefit the local community. The theme we have chosen is "From Slates to I pads". It will be a project to collect oral histories from members and the community who have attended local schools. This is especially important as four state schools in the area. Wynnum Central, Wynnum North, Lindum and Hemmant are to close at the end of 2010. The project is dependent on a grant from the Brisbane City Council. If we obtain the grant we will purchase up to date digital recording equipment. If you are interested in being interviewed for this project please contact myself, Jill Greenhill or members of the Committee.

Our coach tour to the Tramway Museum and Dayboro is coming up on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> September. Lunch is being provided by the Dayboro Historical Society and from all accounts it will be a feast. It is not a long travel day, you will have plenty of time to relax and look around and we will home to Wynnum by 4.30pm. If you haven't put your name down please do so as we will have to confirm numbers after the next meeting.

In 1950 Maxwell Watkin VOWLES, born in Yorkshire England, and his wife Marjorie Hilda (nee JOHNSON) came out to Australia as £10 Pomes with their son Robert Charles VOWLES.

They settled at Lindum and were living at Bulgin Avenue and Sandy Camp Road, Lindum according to the 1954 Queensland Electoral Roll.

I have been contacted by a relative of Maxwell in Yorkshire England who tells me that Maxwell's youngest brother, Denbeigh, is now 83 years old and is trying to locate his brother or any of his descendants.

Mr. CHARLIE MILLS.

Charlie Mills's parents settled in Brisbane in 1863 and Charlie was born in Brisbane around 1886. He served in the Defence Department during the Boer War. In 1900 he entered the Public Service and served with the Army Pay Corps in World Wars I and II, rising to the rank of major. In 1916 he introduced the Air Infantry Service (AIF) Pay Book system which was still in use in 1958.

Charlie married Emma Troutweiler (Trantweiler) on 13 March 1915 and they had three sons, Charles Bayley (26/04/1916), John Lyndall (25/08/1919) and Donald (1924).

In 1922 Charlie resigned from the public service and in 1923 he founded the firm of Charlie Mills and Company, a clothing factory in Charlotte Street, Brisbane. Due to the shortage of labour in the city a branch factory was established at 155 Tingal Road Wynnum in 1944, between Bride and Charlotte Streets. The original 20 machines were increased to 40 machines after 2 months. The decision was made to transfer the whole of the factory to Wynnum and an extension of the then existing building was made. The factory was known for its shirts and pyjamas and during the Second World War produced army uniforms.

In the 1950s import restrictions made it necessary to reduce staff, but the increase in import quotas in 1957 afforded considerable relief and additional permanent staff were taken on.

But Charlie also became involved in the retail trade in Wynnum. About 1910 Mr Ernie S Knox set up as a general draper in a timber shop on the seaward side of Bay Terrace, between Charlotte and Florence Street. Mr J Little purchased that shop, No. 80 Bay Terrace, in 1926 then built himself a brick store next door, costing £1,900, and moved in on 16 May 1930. He was a general draper, a hatter, a mercer and sold clothing 'by well known manufacturers'. Charlie Mills purchased this shop and began trading on 1 July 1944, but Mr Little retained ownership of the brick building and later sold to Bayard's for £10,000.

In a Herald of 28 February 1946 Charlie Mills had "Making-Up" addresses at 12/23 Charlotte Street, Brisbane and at Tingal Road Wynnum and "Shops" at Bay Terrace Wynnum Central and "Mills Bros" at Five Ways Woolloongabba. The newspaper article commented that "stocks are difficult to obtain as the import of cloth is still controlled", presumably after World War II.

Charlie purchased land, further south in Bay Terrace, four doors from the Post office for £5000 and a new modern store was opened at 139 Bay Terrace on 12 October 1956. Son Charlie Mills Junior managed this store and at the opening thanked builder, Mr R Rabjohns, Ford, Hutton and Mewell, Architects and Christie and Walker for the ultra modern shop fittings. Son, Don Mills, was still operating the shop in 1980.

Charlie Mills Senior's main sporting interests were gymnastics, football and sailing. In recognition of his services to the Brisbane Gymnasium as secretary, he was made a life member. In 1906 Rugby League football was introduced to Queensland and the then young Charlie was a foundation member and later elected as an official.

Charlie is listed in the 1950 Telephone Directory as living in Auchenflower. He was also a keen gardener, interested in garden competitions and sailing often took him to Wynnum and Manly.

Charlie died on 27 July 1961 after a short illness aged 75 years. He left his wife and his three sons, Charlie, Lyndall and Don.
