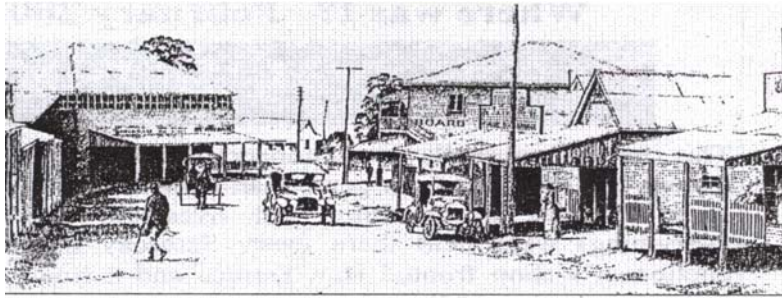

FROM THE PRESIDENT



June, and we are almost halfway through the year. How time flies. Preparations are well in hand for our next Heritage Bus Tour on Saturday 25th June. The coach will leave Wynnum at 8.30am and arrive at the Mercy Heritage Centre at All Hallows School, about 9am. We will then have a conducted tour of the Museum by the Curator Peter Connell. The Mercy Centre is an historical gem, containing artifacts relating to the training and work of the Sisters of Mercy who were based there. 'The Mercy Centre also houses an impressive collection of Roman Catholic reliquaries, including the partial skeleton of a man who died in 199 AD. Associated with these remains is a piece of Roman glass, embedded in plaster, which was originally part of a catacomb wall, probably in Rome. The skeleton, which is thought be that of an unknown Saint and the piece of Roman glass, suggest he was buried in a catacomb sometime between the 2nd – 3rd centuries, at a time when religious persecution of Christians was widespread.' (Nova May 2011)

Following the tour of the Mercy Centre, we will proceed to the Booroolbin Bowls for lunch. The Bowls Club is opposite Newstead House and close to Breakfast Creek. After lunch we will be joined by Beres McCallum of the Windsor & Districts Historical Society. Beres has lived in the Windsor area for a great part of her life and knows the area intimately. She will tell us tales and show us buildings associated with the early pioneers, including Judge Lutwyche, the first Judge of the Supreme Court of Queensland. The famous shop of "Tom Wallace Bicycles" which was located in the area and is still functioning today. Another focus of historical interest is the "Holy Cross Retreat", Wooloowin. In this institution, operated by the Sisters of Mercy, destitute women were cared for and given employment in the laundry. We will also visit the offices of the Windsor & Districts Historical Society. The stone building, constructed of 'Brisbane Tuff' housed the chambers of the Windsor Shire Council. An early Mayor of Windsor and later Lord Mayor of Brisbane, was William Jolly. A photograph of him opening the Manly Baths in 1926 can be found in the Resource Room and 'Merv Beitz Room' in the Wynnum Library. After our tour we will return to Wynnum arriving home at 4.30pm. The trip promises to be a good one and not to be missed.

By the time you receive this newsletter, the play "Presumed Guilty", the tragic tale of Ellen Thomson – the only woman hanged in Queensland, will have been performed in the Wynnum Municipal Hall. However if you missed it you may still see it at The Judith Wright Centre, 420 Brunswick Street, Fortitude Valley on Wed 22, Thu 23, Fri 24 & Saturday 25 of June at 7pm. Bookings 3872 9000.

I hope to see you at our next meeting.

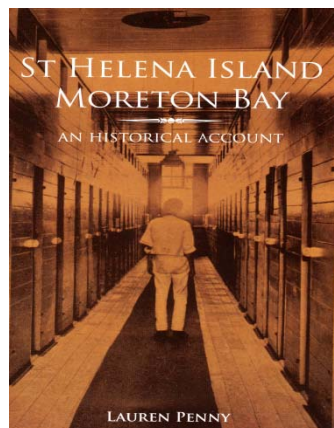

Sandy Liddle and I recently attended the launch of "St Helena Island, Moreton Bay. An Historical Account" by Lauren Penny.

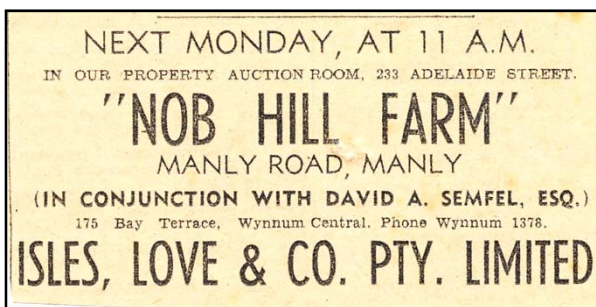
The launch was held at Fort Lytton in the old Quarantine Dining Room, the building that was returned to the Fort area from the previous Fire Training Station on Lytton Road.

In its former life the hall was the "Drill Hall" located adjacent to Memorial Park, and built in 1912 on land donated to the Commonwealth Government by Mr H W Roles, manager of the ESCA Company Brisbane and his partner Jim Fisher owner of the Wynnum Hotel. The suggestion for the need of a local drill hall came from Joseph Curtiss and Major J W Watkins, the Headmaster of Manly School (opened in 1910).

From 1915 a reserve unit of the 26th Battalion formed a rifle club and met for shooting practice on a short 25 yard range in the grounds of the hall. The military unit met for training here.

In 1918 land adjoining the Drill Hall was leased by the Wynnum Manly Agricultural, Horticultural and Industrial Society from the Wynnum Town Council for a peppercorn rental for 10 years. The first outdoor Wynnum Manly Agricultural, Horticultural and Industrial Show was held in this park, Richard Russell Park, in November 1919. As the Show Society had no Pavilion the nearby Commonwealth Military Drill Hall was hired for that purpose. By 1920 the Show Society had erected its own Pavilion.

Due to lack of financial support the last local Show was held in 1936. Wynnum High School was built in the 1940's on part of Memorial Park and the Drill Hall become incorporated into the school. In 1968 the Drill Hall was removed to Iona College to make way for the new High School Hall.

According to Robert Pook, the removalist went bankrupt with the hall still on a temporary base. Local builder Eddie Nunn stumped repaired and modified the Hall which was then used for various activities. In the late 1990's the Hall underwent a major renovation to accommodate the Iona College drama department and was named "Hannah Hall".

“The Lost Woman of Innamincka”
Summary of a story written by Isabella Curtin
“TRUTH” NEWSPAPER HEADLINES

“Mother, Six Children Rescued from Perilous Life”
“Queensland Government acts in grim drama”
“Did father stager off to unknown death?”
(*Brisbane Truth 16 May 1937*)

Henrietta (Ettie) parents, Joseph Henry Darlington and Catherina Elizabeth Olsson (Kate) lived at Littabella, about 20 kms south of Boaga where they leased a property with Frederick Darlington, Joseph's brother. Ettie was born here on 27 February 1904. Joseph sold his share of the property to his brother and moved the family to Bundaberg, where he opened a restaurant in Bourbong Street, near where the Commonwealth Bank stands today. Kate ran a boarding house located where the Council Offices now stand, also in Bourbong Street. Six more children were born. From 1919 Joseph spent 10 years in the Diamantina Hospital in Brisbane with an incurable disease and died on 29 June 1929. Kate had already moved the family to Wowan, north west of Biloela on a property called “Lorraine”. Ettie remembers working in the local store “McSweeneys, Universal Frontier”.

Here, in Wowan, Ettie met John Hill, a sheep drover. A romance developed and they eloped taking the train to Rockhampton, then walking to Calliope and on to Gladstone, then caught a train to Brisbane.

The family undertook a very long walk over 15 years. Their first child Kathleen was born in Brisbane. They set out to walk to St George, but Kathleen died in Warwick of septicaemia. Two other children died and Norman was born in Charleville on 11 April 1928 and Olive Elisabeth at Blackall on 25 December 1929. Nora was born in Mackay on 13 April 1931, Ethel at Longreach on 16 January 1933. Betty was born at Boulia on 12 November 1934.

Ettie and John headed south to Innamincka. They owned an old car with no engine, which was pulled by a horse. Cooper Creek was flooded and father, John and only son, Norman helped Ettie and the girls to cross over the flood. They pitched a lean-to tent under an old tree on the high side of the creek. Ettie was pregnant with her sixth child.

When the family were settled, John set out to walk to Mt Isa to look for work. John was never seen again, only his hat and razor were recovered.

Ettie was pregnant and alone with five children to care for and living in a lean-to tent on the bank of Cooper Creek. They were exposed to the weather and the frequent sand storms. The family were given support buy the Hotel's publican. An aboriginal woman Molly supplied them with goat's milk.

On 18 July 1936, Ettie left 8 year old Norman in charge of his sisters and moved away from their campsite for the birth of her sixth daughter, on the bank of Cooper Creek. The local Mission Sisters brought the family to the Innamincka Hospital (Elizabeth Symon Nursing Home) and the family was looked after properly for the first time.

The Government Authorities were uncertain as to where the family should be sent, Broken Hill, Townsville or Brisbane. Since Ettie was a Queenslander by birth the family were brought back to the Queen Alexandria Home in Coorparoo in Brisbane.

A mother in the small Queensland town of Mullet Creek, Kate Darlington, longed for her daughter, missing for 15 years. She read the article in the “Truth” newspaper about a woman and family rescued from Innamincka. Was this story referring to her long lost daughter? It was! But she did not have the train fare to travel to Brisbane immediately.

Mrs Hill feared that the family would be split up by the State Children's Department, but she stood her ground and a little home was found for the family on the water front at Darling Point, Manly. This was the family's first real home in 15 years. Youngest daughter Isabella spent the first 12 months in Brisbane in Hospital, suffering from malnutrition. Norman and Olive, the eldest daughter were the first of the family to attend Manly State School.

After a few months a larger house was found at 153 Carlton Terrace. Isabella came home from hospital and the family lived there for the next 20 years.

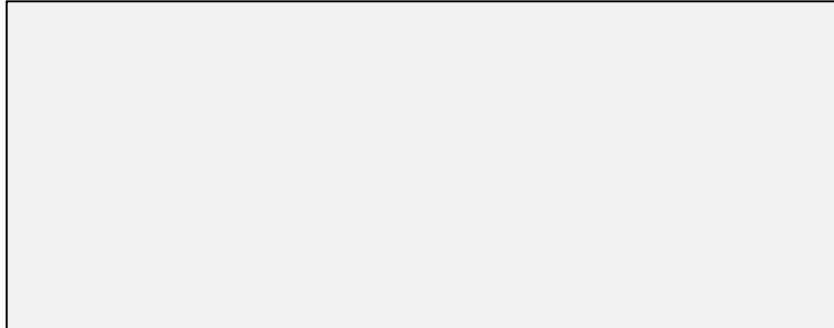
