The museum is only open on Sundays between 12 noon and 4pm. It is located in Church Street, Fortitude Valley, opposite the PCYC. It is well worth a look.

In the future we hope to organise an Oral History workshop. Sandy Liddle, the editor of the newsletter, will be asking for your participation. A workshop might be of interest to many people including those who want to record their family history. It also brings to light many stories from the past as well as preserving your family heritage. Other news of interest concerns the "Manly Pool". I have received a letter from Councillor Cumming to advise me that a new lessee for the Manly Pool has been approved. The successful tenderer was Whitsunday Aquatics Pty Ltd who currently operate the Council Pool and caravan Park in Proserpine. The main highlight of the successful tender was the offer of \$530,000 in capital within the first six years. The improvements to be made by the lessee are:-

- heat the 25m pool
- add a program pool
- · refurbish the entry and kiosk area
- renovate or re-use the residence for another purpose
- add seating areas around the pool.

Unfortunately, the previous tenderers, the Baumer familly, missed out.

Our next meeting in August will be an interesting one. I hope to see you there.

#### Resource Centre Report - August 2009.

• "History Alive" Fort Lytton 25/26 July 2009

A very pleasant weekend was spent watching the antics of the soldiers of by-gone eras. Though seemingly quieter than in previous years, there were an estimated 2000 people through the gates on Sunday.

A big thank you to the members who came out to the Fort to assist with the manning of the Society's display.

- Due to sickness and personal family problems we are a little short of volunteers for the Resource Room on Wednesdays and Thursdays. - Wynnum Creek flows behind Wondall Road State School and then northwards parallel to Wondall Road and in front of Wynnum Manly Leagues Club. Here it is joined by a second creek flowing east west down the northern side of Kougari Oval and then the water runs under Wondall Road and northwards to Stradbroke Avenue. Does anyone know the name of this second creek?

These windows are on the Tingal Road side of the Wynnum Ambulance Station. The station was opened on the corner of Tingal Road and Cedar Street. The two 16 perch blocks were purchased in 1920. Mrs A Thynne laid the foundation stone in January 1926 and the building was officially opened in November 1927 having cost £3285, the result of many euchre parties, Spring Parades, chocolate wheels, etc. The casualty room on the ground floor catered for the minor incidents in the district and was very much used by low-income families in the Depression.

The centre ceased to operate in Tingal Road in 1996, when new ambulance facilities were built next to the hospital in Whites Road, Lota. The old building has become the home of a Queensland Ambulance Museum and was heritage listed in 1999.



#### **OUR PIONEERS - Johnston SMYTH**

The Society has a continuing Project to collect information on persons residing in Wynnum, Manly Lota and District before 1912. In 1912 Wynnum became a town in its own right and there were only a few hundred people residing here at that time.



Johnston Smyth was born at Gurtenar, County Leithrim in Ireland in 1862 and came to Australia, in 1877 at the age of 14, in the Royal Mail steamship "Cloncurry".

Johnston married Ellen Louisa Cobb, also from Ireland, on 23 August 1893 and they had five boys and four girls. Ellen Louisa died in 1928 and Johnston remarried Lillian Stringfellow.

In 1895 Johnston was employed to care for the shade trees on the beachfront at a yearly salary of £4/18/6.

Johnston was a trooper for four years in the Queensland Mounted Infantry and for three years held the rank of Sergeant of the well-known "A" company and gave devoted service to the building up the Defence Forces of Australia. He was serving with his company when the Duke of York, later King George V, reviewed Queensland troops at Lytton in 1901.

Johnston was involved in the petition to request the removal of Lytton School to Prospect Street/Tingal Road, Wynnum North in 1911.

Johnston was a founding member of the Wynnum Lodge of Oddfellows

Johnston became a member of the Wynnum Town Council in 1913. He was Mayor in 1915. He was still a local alderman in 1921 when the new concrete Fox Street Bridge was opened.

Johnston left Wynnum to take up Diamond Vale Station in the Pikedale District. He was elected Mayor of Stanthorpe in 1924 and 1926.

Johnston's passion was for the game of bowls. He is reported to have traveled weekly by horse and sulky, for 13 miles to play a game every week. He was President of the Stanthorpe Club and then elected a life member. He died in the company of his bowling friends on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 1949 on Stanthorpe Bowling Green, aged 67 years.

#### SPOTLIGHT ON ... Leslie George GREENHILL



Leslie George Greenhill was born the second twin of the first-born at 6.10 pm, 16 April 1932 in the attic of the old house at 47 Alkoomie Street then called Hill Street. His father was Knut Robert Wilhelm Gronberg, a Swedish merchant seaman deserter. Les' mother, Grace Gertie Feige, was the daughter of George and Mary Feige. The surname "Gronberg" was anglicised to Greenhill in 1942.

Les had ancestors in England, Ireland, Germany and Sweden. Martin Fraly an Irish convict was transported to Sydney to serve seven years for stealing a "cow". Later, the emancipated convict Fraly was transported to Brisbane for injuring an ox. After serving time as the colony's official miller, Fraly squatted on land where the Breakfast Creek Hotel now stands. His daughter, Mary Hennessy (nee Fraly) was the first female, licensed victualler at Breakfast Creek.

Fraly's great grand daughter and Leslie's grandmother was Mary Louise Hennessy who married George Feige, the son of Georg Feige and Mary Weller, German migrants.

Les first attended Wynnum North State School in 1937 and transferred to Wynnum Central State School in 1941. In 1944, he attended Wynnum State High and Intermediate School until year ten in 1946. He was an indifferent student and relished the passing of his early schooling. Eventually, Les returned to part-time study and, eventually, in chronological order, gained qualification in: the following - a Certificate in building, a Bachelor of Arts Degree, a Masters Degree in Public Administration. On retirement, Les studied for a Masters Degree in Journalism.

Les married Janice Langford in 1955 and they had three daughters Jennene Ann, Anita Grace and Tricia Adelle. Janice, an asthmatic sufferer, died in January 1982. In September 1983 Les married Gillian Margaret Burrows nee Potter, who has two daughters Amanda Keryn and Sian Michelle.

Ironically, on January 1947, twins Les and Robert began employment as apprentice carpenters with the Queensland Public Works Department on the Wynnum Central State School. Les remained employed with the Works Department to become a works foreman. In 1959 he was employed by the Queensland Education Department as a Manual Arts Teacher and taught in Mount Morgan for six years before he was transferred to his old high school at Wynnum, then he was posted to Maryborough Technical College as a trade teacher. In 1965, he was promoted to Senior Trade teacher at Eagle Farm Technical College and then, in rapid succession, he was promoted to be a Curriculum Officer, acting Supervisor of the Correspondence School, Principal of Mackay College and, finally Principal of Bald Hills Technical College. Les retired from work in 1988 and, after living on an acreage at McDowell, owner-built the residence at 47 Alkoomie Street.

During the 1969-71 period he served as an alderman on the Maryborough City Council as chairman of the Water and Sewerage Committee.

On the sporting fields, Les has claimed moderate successes in swimming (High School Junior Champion), Surf Life Saving (Captain Point Lookout 1953 -54), Rugby League (Wynnum/Manly 1952-59, Wynnum Fishermen 1952-54, Hamilton and Meatworkers{shift workers league}1955-56, Rockhampton North 1960-62 and 1965-68. Mount Morgan 1963, Maryborough Brothers and Rovers Football Clubs 1965-71). He played representative football for Brisbane, Rockhampton, Central Queensland and Maryborough.

As a member of a family boasting four legendary professional fishermen, Les has many interests. His hobbies include local history, bonsai, creative writing, visual art and wood carving. He was, for a time, a voluntary supervisor for a Creative Writing Group in the University of the Third Age. He is an active member of the Wynnum/Manly Historical Society and Waterloo Bay Probus Club.
