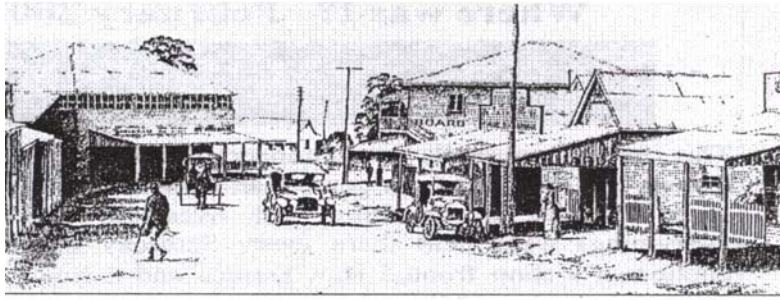

NEWS FROM THE RESOURCE CENTRE – April 2010

- David Bell of St Killda, Melbourne contacted the Society as he is searching for information about his great grandmother who lived in Tingal Road from 1919 to 1946.

Can anyone add any more details?

“Augusta Jane Caroline SANDROCK, maybe born in 1850 in Greenwich, married Edward SIMPSON in 1868 at Sweers Island. After she left her husband she took the name of Augusta JAMES”.

The Post Office directories from 1922 to 1940 list a Caroline James living in Tingal Road. Electoral Roll records indicate that “Caroline James, a dressmaker lived at “The Hut”, Tingal Road from 1919 to 1921 and at “Marazion”, on the southern corner of Tingal Road and Clara Street, from 1922 to 1946.

Jack Sands remembers visiting an old lady, Mrs James, with the Baptist Church Youth Group. They would sing songs with her.

Does anyone else have any memories of Mrs James? David Bell is visiting the district in September to find her unmarked grave in Hemmant cemetery.

- Kay Vidovich is searching for information about her father.

John JONES was born in Brisbane and grew up around the Wynnum Manly area and also attended schools in the area. His best friend from 3 years of age was Lester Arthus, who says that John left school at the age of 14 and immediately began work on a vegetable farm for the Mickle family. The farm was situated where the Methodist church, Retirement units and Marching Girls field in Wondall Road are located.

Les Athus and Elva (daughter of the Fred Mickle) say that newspaper reporters came to the farm and took a photo of John holding a large cabbage. The photograph was published pointing out that the local farmers had grown extra food to feed the American soldiers. When the soldiers were sent home this excess food was wasted and dumped.

Kay would like a copy of the photograph of John with the cabbage. Any ideas?

- Can anyone provide the location of the former St Margaret's Church of England in Primrose Parade?. A “Birds and Flowers Festival” was held there on Thursday 30 July 1970. When was the church in use – was the building moved to another site?

Here is a familiar sight as one drives along Wynnum Esplanade.

Neville Balue came to Wynnum in 1922 to work on the recently installed electricity service. He converted a 25' sailing boat to a bay boat and called her "Lizzie". He applied to the then Town Council of Wynnum to build a slip for her at the bottom of Havelock (now Penfold) Parade. The boat and slip passed to his son-in-law and the hardwood stilts still stand today, a useful perch for pelicans and sea birds.



Note the holes in the posts. The boat to be serviced is floated between the stilts on high tide and the bearers are adjusted beneath. When the tide ebbs, the barnacles can be scraped of the bottom of the boat ready or painting.

OUR PIONEERS – William ATTWOOD

The Society has a continuing Project to collect information on persons residing in Wynnum, Manly Lota and District before 1912. In 1912 Wynnum became a town in its own right and there were only a few hundred people residing here at that time.

This month we feature **WILLIAM ATTWOOD**.



William ATTWOOD was born at West End. His father, also William, was born in Paddington, London in 1851. The date of his arrival here is unknown. William's mother was Sophia Jane HOLT and she was born at Amherst, Victoria in 1856.

William, known as Will, was a plumber and began his training in Brisbane with Podmore's Plumbing, which later became Watson Brothers. Will had a good singing voice and sang at the silent movie theatre at West End. In 1911, after his marriage to Annie PEGG and the birth of his daughter, Doris, he and his family, and the PEGG family, moved to Manly to live in Stratton Terrace, then Mountjoy Terrace. The PEGG and the ATTWOOD families then moved to adjacent houses, No 16 and No 18 Ernest St Manly. Will and Annie's family included four girls and one boy born between 1930 and 1941.

Will started his own plumbing business and did well. He employed three men and used a horse, named "Nigger", and a dray. He bought five allotments of land in New Street and Lota Road directly behind the two houses in Ernest Street and had a house built where they then lived. He added a tennis court.. He had a thirty-two foot launch and the family enjoyed many outings on the bay and its islands.

Will played Rugby League at Memorial Park and arranged many matches as fund-raisers for charity with the players dressing in fancy dress.. He was a member of the Wynnum Masonic Lodge for a time in the 1920's. He would sing at concerts and his two older daughters accompanied him on piano and violin. He was a member of the Wynnum Bowls Club and later the Manly Bowls Club, which he and members of his family along with others, helped to construct. He also was responsible for the plumbing of Cleveland and Balmoral Bowls Clubs.

During the Depression, he sold his lovely house and the family moved around for a while in rented houses – Uplands Terrace, Chestnut Street. In 1932 they were living with Will's mother on the Esplanade at Wynnum South. They then went to live with Annie's mother at 16 Ernest Street, Manly.

Somerset Dam was being constructed and cottages were being built for the workers. Will and his son Bill went up there to do the plumbing of these cottages. They lived in a tent and Annie divided her time between them and the rest of the family at Ernest Street, Manly. Their daughter Doris, whose husband Roy Wills had also obtained a job at the construction site of the dam, rotated with Annie in these duties. When the cottages were completed Will and Bill returned to Manly but Doris and Roy obtained a cottage to live in and remained there until 1942.

Will continued playing lawn bowls at Manly Bowls Club and won many trophies until he had a leg amputated. He was still living in Ernest Street when he died in 1964.

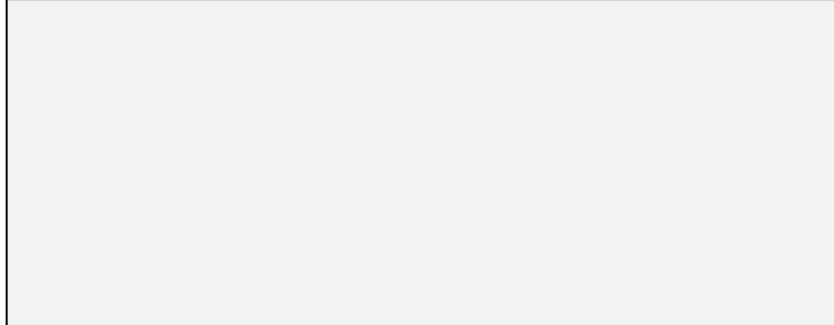
