



The two names, Heather Roberts and Jean Morrow, are mounted in the garden bed, near the entrance to the new Wynnum State School



Heather Roberts, formerly Smith, married David Roberts and they went as Missionaries to India. On their return they lived on a property through the cutting in Wynnum North Road opposite the site of the original Lytton School. Heather became a Grade 6 teacher at Wynnum North State School. She was interested in Exchange students and often boarded them. She retired, as she turned 60, and died a few weeks later.

Jean Morrow taught Grade 2 at Wynnum North State School and died while still a teacher at the school. The children remembered her as she had very long fingernails and they used to scratch the board. Both teachers were loved and respected by students and parents.

St. Oswald." Name selected for North Church of England

The new church in Prospect Street will be known as St Oswald's Church of England, Wynnum North.

Because St. Oswald is one of the lesser known Saints, the committee suggested that an outline of his work be published.

Oswald was the son of Edwin, King of Northumbria, who received Christianity into his kingdom. Edwin was defeated and slain and Christianity blotted out in the kingdom. But Oswald flew north to Scotland, and there he was given sanctuary and friendship in monasteries which were off-shoots of St Columba's Monastery of Iona.

When Oswald received his kingdom in 635 A.D. he sent to lona for teachers to re-establish Christianity in his kingdom.

As a result, the saintly Aiden was sent, who established a monastic settlement of the Celtic Church on the Island of Lindisfarne, off the coast of Yorkshire. Then he began the work of the conversion of Northumbria.

The Chronicler of the period describes Oswald and Aiden working together, and of the churches rising everywhere in the land

It was this stream of Celtic Christianity from the north which fused with the stream working upwards from Canterbury (St. Augustine to establish one church for the Anglo Saxon Kingdoms at the Synod of Whitby in 664 A.D., thus leading the way to unity in the realm.

This article appeared in the Wynnum Herald of 16 May 1956. Is anyone able to provide details of the history of St Oswald's Wynnum North? When did the church open? When was the closure? What became its use after closure? All contributions gratefully received.

The late Molly HINCHLIFFE

In October 2012, one of our most endearing and beloved members, Molly Hinchliffe, passed away at the age of 91. Her nephew, Gordon Collie, has kindly provided us with the Eulogy he presented at her funeral held at St Pauls on 1 November 2012 to share with the members of the Wynnum Manly Historical Society.

My Aunty Molly is fondly remembered today as a feisty little Scottish lady with whom I shared a couple of common bonds – we were both Hinchliffe family outlaws and both foreigners.

Molly was born Mary Tripney Brown in West Lothian, Scotland in 1921, the youngest of three girls in her family. She trained in accounting, but despite not formally qualifying she worked for the Government and a chartered accountant.

Molly immigrated from Scotland with her young son Leslie arriving in Australia in 1950. Leslie was tragically killed in a motor accident in 1963 at the age of 21.

On arrival in Brisbane she embarked on what was to be a 38 year career with the Wynnum family timber and hardware business Bunney and Son.

Molly used to say she had a very informal interview with the owner Ted Bunney who simply gave her a bundle of invoices to process. Her figure work was good enough to get a job in accounts and she eventually became credit manager.

Could you imagine trying to get a dodgy credit application past Molly?

With her good timber and hardware connections, Molly had her home built at 11 Andrew Street Lota where she lived right up until the last three months.

In 1957 a young jackaroo Ted Hinchliffe came in from the bush and got a job at Bunneys where an office romance bloomed.

Molly and Ted were married in the Lota Presbyterian Church on May 8, 1965.

Ted's love of the outdoors led the couple on their first visit to the Willows Gemfield in central Queensland in 1969. They became regular visitors, buying a shack in 1980 and gradually improving it. In their retirement they would spend six months of the year at the Willows where they made firm lifelong friends all over Australia.

Ted learned to cut gemstones and Molly enjoyed wearing them.

Molly was for many years during her working career a member of the womens service organisation Quota.

She had an enormous circle of friends through her many community activities including the Friends of Lota House, an Anglicare aged facility. Right into her 80s she used to say she enjoyed helping the old people.

Molly kept fit and active with her Line Dancing group up until just before her 90th birthday.

She and Ted were active members of the Wynnum Manly Historical Society and also took a keen interest in politics as members of the National Party, now the LNP.

Just a couple of weeks ago we shared a laugh when she got a letter from the party advising that she was old enough to be entitled to free membership for the rest of her life.

Molly spent her last three months in the Tricare Stafford Heights Nursing Home where she enjoyed a constant stream of visitors, much to the amazement of the staff.

They were really pleased when she got her own phone connected so they didn't have to spend half their life ferrying messages.

Molly was strong and alert right up to the last few days and greatly enjoyed the deluge of cards and good wishes for her 91st birthday earlier this month.

Last week she told me she felt ready to go and join her beloved husband Ted.

Ted has a lovely bush resting spot at Hemmant where we planted one of his favourite desert roses and Molly will be very happy there beside him.

2 WOMEN IN DARING SAFETY BID

45 Escape Fire: Family Wiped Out

One woman leapt 15ft. from a balcony and another climbed 24ft. down a drain-pipe to escape the flames when fire destroyed a two-storey boarding-house at Wynnum Central early yesterday morning.

A third woman, aged 74, and crippled with arthritis, was burnt about the face when she tottered back into the blazing building to rescue her possessions.

The guest-house was occupied by 45 people, including 16 children.

Mrs. Sarah Livingstone, 59, who jumped from the balcony, was taken to hospital suffering from a fractured pelvis and shock.

The woman who escaped by climbing down the drain-pipe was **Mrs Amy Curren**. **Mrs. Alice Deagan**, 74-year-old widow, who was burnt, is the mother of **Mr. Joe Deagan**, manager of the boarding-house, **Ingleston**, **Charlotte Street**, **Wynnum Central**.

When the fire was first noticed at 2.25 am, **Mr. Deagan** ran through the house waking the guests. He then went to his mother's bedroom and carried her out to the lawn to safety.

Unnoticed, she tottered back towards her bedroom, until flames blocked her path. Wynnum ambulance bearers treated her for burns and severe shock, and rushed her to the General Hospital.

ALL LOST HEAVILY

All guests lost most of their possessions in

the fire, which reduced the house to ashes in 25 minutes.

One, a traveling jeweler, is said to have lost £200 of samples. Another guest, who had £100 stored in a drawer of his dressing table, grabbed the wrong drawer when he rushed from the house, and his money was burnt.

The blaze was watched by a crowd of 300 people, most of them in night attire. At 3.15am, Wynnum Police under **Sergeant F N Aspinall**, made a tour of neighbouring houses and boarding-houses to arrange temporary accommodation for the homeless guests.

The house was a 2-storey wooden building more than 30 years old.




