



### **President's Report** (continued from page 1)

After the tour we shared lunch at the Shingle Inn which is now on the ground floor of City Hall, and were most impressed to see how faithfully it has been restored. Quite a nostalgic time for some of us.

Some October anniversaries include:

2nd October 1788 - With the newly established settlement of Sydney facing starvation, Governor Phillip sent the Sirius to Cape Town to obtain supplies. Captain John Hunter sailed before the Roaring Forties via Cape Horn. His return voyage took seven months! Our early settlers certainly needed a great deal of fortitude! 30th October 1956 – The Suez Canal was closed by British action during the Suez Crisis and was not re-opened until April 1957. The Canal was closed again in June 1967, when it was blocked by ships sunk in the Arab-Israeli conflict and did not re-open until June 1975.

 $\underline{9^{\text{th}}}$  October 1887 – The railway line between Townsville and Hughenden was completed.

<u>14<sup>th</sup> October 1824</u> – The weekly 'Australian' appeared in Sydney. This was the first privately owned newspaper to be published in the colony. Proprietors were barristers William Charles Wentworth and Robert Wardell.

<u>Ist October 1887</u> – Henry Lawson's first printed poem 'Song of the Republic' was printed in the Bulletin. According to literary critic David Wright, while living, Lawson had many imitators, but no peers. Unfortunately, I don't have a copy of the poem mentioned. However, I will share some of one of my favourites with you.

It is entitled, "Scots of the Riverina".

The boy cleared out to the city from his home at the harvest time — They were Scots of the Riverina, and to run from home was a crime. The old man burned his letters, the first and last he burned, And he scratched his name from the Bible when the old wife's back was turned.

A year went past, and another. There were calls from the firing-line; They heard the boy had enlisted, but the old man made no sign. His name must never be mentioned on the farm by Gundagai — They were Scots of the Riverina with ever the kirk hard by.

The boy was killed at Flanders, where the best and bravest die.

There were tears at the Grahame homestead, and grief in Gundagai;

But the old man ploughed at daybreak and the old man ploughed till the mirk –

There were furrows of pain in the orchard while his household went to the kirk.

The hurricane lamp in the rafters dimly and dimly burned, And the old man died at the table when the old wife's back was turned. Face down on his bare arms folded he sank with his wild grey hair Outspread o'er the open Bible and a name rewritten there.

All for now. Looking forward to seeing you at our next meeting.

I feel that the two enquiries are related. St Mary's Hospital was located on the corner of Bay Terrace and Edith Street (now Ian Fry's Building) from about 1917 to 1924, until the hospital was moved to Chestnut Street and is still standing, almost to Tingal Road on the left.

# The Shingle Inn Cafe



The historic Shingle Inn in Edward Street was built by David Webster in the Depression of the 1930's.

David first ventured into the bread business in Brisbane in 1883, but by 1900 he was specialising in cakes and biscuits. There was a need in Brisbane for the availability of a "light repast" for City visitors and David set up 11 establishments, one being in Wynnum.

By 1912 the press report that Mr Webster's cafes and luncheon rooms were well patronised.

In the early 1930's, the press announced that there was to be created, in Edward Street, a scheme copying the English "Wayside House". The internal walls were covered with wood veneer panels. The table layout was in "Pullman" style with high settle seats and fixture tables. The roof was of shingles. The architects were Messrs Hall and Phillip and the building contractor, Mr W Lee. The shop fittings were supplied by Messrs Burns, John and Humphries

The Shingle Inn opened on 4 February 1936 with W R Webster, David's son, as Managing Director. David Webster died three months later.

During early 1970s Webster Company was bought out by an Canadian Company who had little concern for the standing of this Queensland

cultural landmark. However after brief negotiations, Noel and Barbara Bellchambers took over Shingle Inn in 1975, maintaining the staff and food standards. The Inn was listed by the Queensland Heritage Council in 1996.

With the pressures from modernisation and redevelopment of the inner city, the Inn was dismantled in 2002 and all the parts put in storage. Today, on its former site stands "Queen's Plaza". In April 2013 the original Shingle Inn was re-erected on the ground floor, within the precinct of the City Hall

The Bellchamber sons, Peter and Andrew today run a company franchising Shingle Inn in thirty locations, priding themselves on maintaining the tradition of constructing stores with undeniable character, quality decor and providing the highest quality food. cakes and coffee.



# Chenille factory to start in Wynnum \$100,000 venture will employ 30

An industrialist from Belfast, Ireland, who has been associated with the weaving and dyeing industry all his life, has moved into Wynnum and already begun factory construction to house plant and machinery which should reach Brisbane in May.

He is Mr James Meikle, whose associate companies in Northern Ireland, Eire and New Zealand, Irish Tapestrys Ltd produce chenille bedspreads, bath mats, etc., in the modern tufting machinery which will be duplicated for the Wynnum factory.

Mr Meikle began operations in New Zealand nine years ago and came to Queensland six months ago to study the potential of this State for the chenille industry.

In an interview with "The Herald" yesterday, Mr Meikle said he was very impressed with what he saw in Brisbane and was confident there was an excellent future for the establishment of his industry in Queensland.

"I was given every assistance by the office of the Minister for Industrial Development and of the industrial areas shown to me. I personally selected Wynnum as the site for future operations".

### BAKERY CONVERTED

Some months ago Mr Meikle purchased the old established Carr's Bakery site and premises, as well as the new residence in Berrima Street.

Already the bakery plant has been removed, walls pulled down and alterations are being carried out to the interior of these premises in preparation for the arrival of weaving and dyeing machinery. Mr Meikle holds a degree in science and engineering technology from the University of London and the Queen's University in Belfast. He has designed much of the plant used in his industry in Ireland and New Zealand and will proceed with further plant designing as special effects are needed.

### JET CAR

A man who has been interested in motor cycle and car racing for many years, Mr Meikle was the designer and engineer of the first jet racing car run at the Kinkiston circuit in Northern Ireland in 1957 and the first in the world.

He has also raced in England at Goodwood and was awarded the Rosebowl for his effort in creating the jet racer. A family man, Mr Meikle is accompanied by his wife, two daughters and one son. Mrs Meikle herself has been associated with the weaving trade and was also the holder of an Irish tennis championship title. The daughters, Heather (16) and Carolyn (14) are students of the Moreton Bay College, while son George (12) attends "Churchie".

In New Zealand Heather was the holder of the girls long jump championship in the under 15 years division at Waikato, while Carolyn has shown her prowess as a sprinter over the 100 yards course.

### MANAGER

Mr Meikle said a Brisbane man had been appointed manager of the Wynnum factory and would be flown to Northern Ireland to study the weaving industry before the Wynnum plant was opened.

He estimated it would take about 12 months before full staff training would be completed and the Wynnum factory would be self-supporting from its own production line.
