

A Street name, now gone.

Last month we were seeking a Brock's Road in Lindum, now possibly named Crawford Road.

Now we have been alerted to a former Bock's Road in Hemmant, now possibly named Canberra Street. Brock's Road may have been a local name for the road/s in which members of the large Brock family lived. No reference to Brocks Road can be found on the early local maps. Any more ideas?

• Former Mount Carmel Convent

Have you noticed that the former Convent is for sale again?

On 11 September 2011, Savills Real Estate made the announcement that the Convent had been sold for \$1.6million "a new record residential sale price for the Bayside Brisbane suburb". The property was the third former Convent sold by the Agents on behalf of the Sisters of Mercy, following previous convent sales at Paddington and West End. The property was advertised as containing twenty rooms and set on half an acre of land overlooking Moreton Bay. Constructed in 1915, the building is of cultural significance and listed on the Queensland Heritage Register. The lady who came to talk to the Society last October (2012) about possible uses for the building never appeared again to collect our ideas. One wonders to what use the building can be put.

Bone family featured in club's sailing history

Herbert Bone came to Wynnum in 1902 and was one of the clubs foundation members.

He lived at Wellington St. Manly before building the family home, which still stands today at Gordon Parade.

Herbert's daughter Mrs Norma Ansell still lives in the family home.

The Wynnum and Manly club was formed in the 1910-1911 sailing season.

Herbert was timekeeper and starter for the club. A position which he held for many years.

He also was one of several bayside sailors who put a lot of time and effort into establishing a place for club members and friends on Green Island.

Herbert was responsible for making a garden bed on the island in the shape of the club's crest.


The island also boasted a grandstand, barbecues and picnic tables.

The improvements to the island were officially opened for the first annual trip on February 1, 1919.

Events on the program for the opening day included novelty races, a fishing competition and tug-o-war.

One of the novelty aces included running 25 yards, sitting down and eating a pie and drinking a bottle of ginger beer before running another 25 yards.

The Bone family had a long association with the Wynnum and Manly Sailing Club.



Herbert was presented with a gold Wynnum and Manly club crest with the inscription on the back of it: "To Herbert Bone for past services 2-9-1919".


Herbert was a sign writer and started the family company H Bone and Son which was well known on the bayside.

His love of sailing was taken up by his sons Harry and Harold. Harry and Harold made names for themselves in the sailing races held on Waterloo Bay in the early 1920s.

They skippered the Evans and won several trophies. Harold was the most promising sailor of the two. He was given the reins of the Evans after Harry had graduated to the senior ranks.

Harold had won two club championships in the junior ranks when he was struck down with appendicitis and died at 17 years of age just before the championships on January 3, 1925.

A Dingey Romance

When the smart little clipper Evans won the championship of the dingey section of the Manly Yacht Club on New Years Day you could not but think of the successful but tragic career of the little boat.


Evans was one of the original dingeys presented to the club by Mr Harry Hart some years ago and she was sailed by

Harry Bone who as time went on graduated to the senior ranks of the club leaving the boat in the hands of his brother Harold.

Harold gave promise of developing into a skipper of unusual attainments and further adding to the reputation of the Evans when he was cut off by his untimely death.


Evans was then passed into the hands of her erstwhile forward hand, Bert Shepherd who sailed with signal success reaching its zenith when the little craft won the championships, by what seemed like an hour – absolutely outclassing every boat in the race.

Harold Spencer Bone also was presented with a gold medal from the Manly Yacht Club. The inscription on the back of it read: "Presented by Walker and Hall to Harold S Bone, skipper of the Evans 23-2-1924.

A COLOURFUL TEACHING CAREER COMES TO AN END



Retired Principal Phyllis Pledger—"It was great to wake up the other day and not have to go to school."

From a fledgling teacher at Wynnum North Primary School, Phyllis Pledger has come full circle to end her career as principal of Wynnum North State High. Miss Pledger's early retirement followed a long and colorful career which began with a short teaching appointment to Wynnum North Primary many years ago.

Her reluctance to give an exact date, for fear of revealing her age, showed in a half smile.

"All I can say is my family and I have lived in this area for more than 50 years and I've been a teacher for over 40," Miss Pledger said.

As she sat comfortably in the sunroom of her Wynnum Heights home, an engaging sense of humor punctuated her conversation.

"I did my country service at Emu Creek Upper provisional school, out west," she said.

"It was a one-teacher school. I'll never forget when I first saw the little timber schoolhouse.

BRISBANE'S first female secondary school principal has retired.

"It had been closed for two months before I arrived because the children had scabies. Goats had taken up residence on the front veranda."

"But I got things going, and when I look back now I'd have to say the three years I spent there were some of the most rewarding in my time."

Born in Kingaroy and educated at Wynnum Central State Primary School, Miss Pledger said there was some justification for the old-guard school of discipline.

Standards have to be set right from the beginning, she said.

"You have to start at Year 8. Setting those standards is the biggest battle," she said.

Once in line, you'll find most students become proud of the school's standards and anyone who isn't cooperating obviously will be in the minority.

"Then you can rely on the seniors for the tone of the school."

After her country service at Emu Creek Upper, Miss Pledger returned to Wynnum North Primary for six years before leaving again for more country service.

She returned to the bayside in 1958 as one of the four original teachers at Manly West State Primary.

"With the abolition of the Scholarship examination, she was transferred to secondary education and taught at Balmoral State High where she was senior mistress for many years.

She was promoted to deputy principal of Sunnybank State High and then to principal at Rosewood State High, west of Ipswich.

In 1986 she was transferred to Wynnum North High as principal. It was a promotion which made her the first female high school principal in the Brisbane metropolitan area.

"Really the wheel has turned full circle from Wynnum North back to Wynnum North," she said.

"I'm very happy now that I've retired. If you give everything you have to your work then you are under a certain amount of stress."

"It was great to wake up the other day and not have to go to school."

Miss Pledger intends travelling now she has the time.

A trip to Cape York is planned with friends for the middle of the year and she hopes to go trekking in Nepal at a later date.


Apart from travelling, Miss Pledger said she would be pursuing her interests in croquet, bushwalking, the Wynnum Manly Zonta Club and bird watching.
