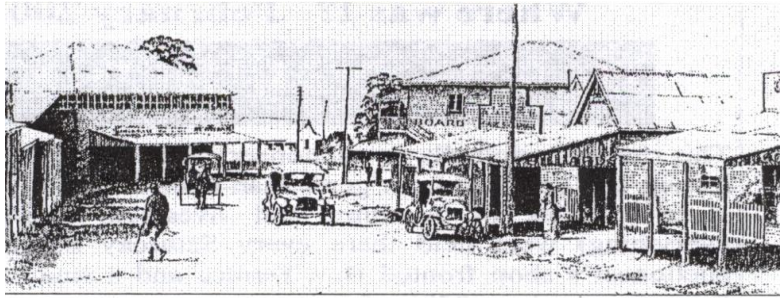

NEWS FROM THE PRESIDENT

November 2013

Greetings .. on the occasion of our last newsletter for 2013. Where has 2013 gone? It is almost too much to consider that we have only a few short weeks until Christmas, and then a short time until we welcome in the new year and all the new experiences it brings with it.



In thinking of the new year, I recall that lovely poem by Alfred, Lord Tennyson, who became poet laureate in 1850, called "In Memorium". It is quite a long poem, but section CVI refers to ringing out the old year, and ringing in the new. I will share some of it with you ...

"Ring out the old, ring in the new,
Ring happy bells, across the snow:
The year is going, let him go;
Ring out the false, ring in the true.

Ring out the grief that saps the mind,
For those that here we see no more;
Ring out the feud of rich and poor,
Ring in redress to all mankind.

Ring out false pride in place and blood,
The civic slander and the spite;
Ring in the love of truth and right
Ring in the common love of good."

They are powerful words, written more than a century ago, but nevertheless relevant to our times too.

In order to observe "deadlines", I am writing these words in early November, and fondly remember those times back before the 1960s when each year we celebrated "Guy Fawkes Night" or "cracker night" on 5 November. All the children in the area looked forward to this event, saving up to spend their money on fireworks to celebrate the occasion. They were fun times. However, how many of us thought that we were actually celebrating what was in fact an act of treason.

On 5 November 1605 in London, a group of plotters tried to blow up the palace of Westminster during the opening of the new session of Parliament. Had they succeeded, in all probability, they would have killed the King (James I) as well as many members of Parliament. However, the plot was foiled before the gang could touch off the charges.

The plot was devised by Robert Catesby, a devout Catholic, set on avenging what he saw as the persecution of his co-religionists. With him, and arrested even as he prepared to light the fuse, was a gentleman called Guy Fawkes. Catesby actually had two plans: to blow up Parliament, and to trigger a Catholic uprising in the Midlands. Guy Fawkes was deputed to plant the gunpowder, placing iron bars on top of the barrels in order to cause the maximum amount of destruction. Catesby, in the meantime, had arranged a hunting party of Catholic gentry in Warwickshire - his aim being to help the gang seize power.

However, the plotters were betrayed when Francis Tresham, sent a warning to his brother-in-law, Lord Mounteagle - who as a Lord, would be among the potential victims. He, in turn, advised the government. Fawkes was immediately taken into custody, thus foiling their "gunpowder plot".

The consequent outcome was that Guy Fawkes was hanged, drawn and quartered (a gruesome death) on 1 February 1606, just five days after his trial before Sir Edward Coke. Robert Catesby was shot while resisting the King's men at Holbeche House in Staffordshire.

It was reported at the time that Guy Fawkes was so badly tortured, he had to be carried up the steps of the scaffold. Aren't you glad that we now live in a so-called more "civilised" age? One has to wonder though - are we any more civilised when we see some of the atrocities being perpetrated in the world today.

In closing, I would like to wish you and your families a very meaningful, safe and joyful Christmas, and a happy, healthy and fulfilling year ahead. Looking forward to see you at the next meeting.

- *A query for information about “Dirty George” for a photographic Society . . .*
Rhonda Demarco made the request, which was passed on to Cherrie Nicholson in whose book “Lota through Local Eyes” she provides a detailed description of the life of George .

Dan Bedford has an old radio and on the wooden case is a reference to “MORREN, Hugh G, Electrician”.
Hugh G Morren lived on the left side of Florence (Ronald)Street, over the railway line and past Andrew Street. He and his wife, Dora Isabel Morren, lived there from 1925 to 1939. (Post Office Directories) His business is not advertised in the *Waterloo Bay Leader* and the *Wynnum Herald* did not appear until 1946.
Does anybody remember Hugh Morren, the electrician?

- *A recent addition to our collection*



This collection of magazines once belonged to Mrs Thomas Pratt of Cedar Street Wynnum who died in 1957 at the age of 106 years and was donated to us by Anne Georgiou. Note the date of production!

The eight-page magazine was produced weekly between 7 July 1832 to 28 December 1844 and contained details of world-wide places, plants, animals, sayings, poems, even giving ten rules for an ordinary life, an example being, “When angry count to ten before you speak; if very angry, a hundred.”

The magazine was produced as an Anglican rival to the *Penny Magazine* as a way for the working man to educate himself.

- *The Life of Frank Davies and his contribution to the Wynnum and Manly Community*

We thank John Davies, Frank’s brother for delivering Frank’s Eulogy to the Society. John is a Life Member of our Society. Frank was not a member but was active in Rotary, Legacy, Chamber of Commerce, Meals on Wheels, Red Cross and Fort Lytton Historical Association.

Frank traded with Eric Bingham in a menswear store situated on the corner of Edith Street and Bay Terrace from 1946. George Sands was the silent partner. The shop, now round the corner in Edith Street, still bears the name “DBS Menswear”

I was in Prospect Street, looking at the remains of the Wynnum North State School swimming pool.

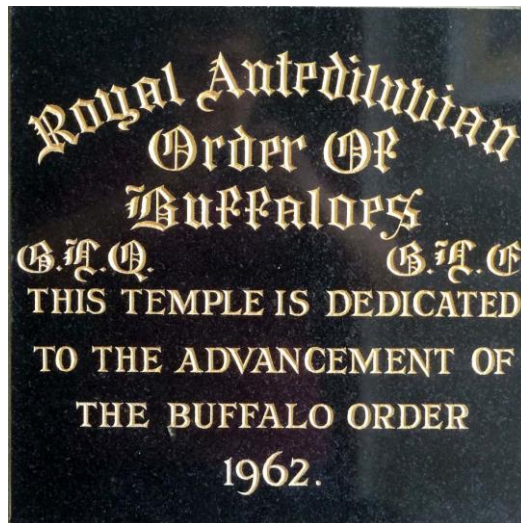
The shelter roof to the northern end of the pool had this plaque attached to it . So far no-one has any memories of Debbie Vanderloos.

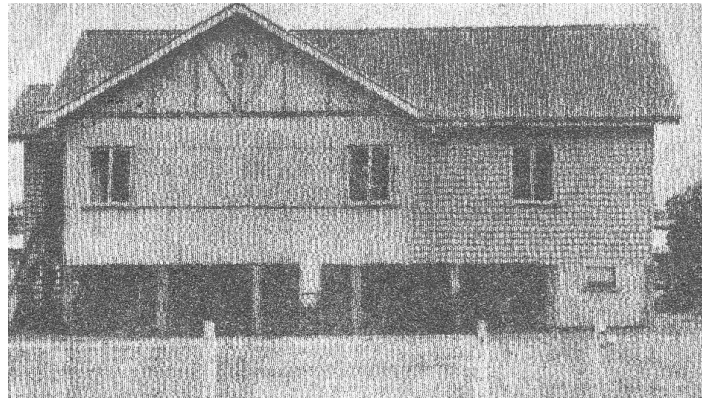

BAPTIST CHURCH, WHITES ROAD, LOTA

In January this year (2013), a visitor enquired at the Resource Centre about the building shown below. Our Tuesday "Newspaper Searcher", Margaret Bulloch, has found the answer.



Bayside Baptist Church on the move

Next Sunday will see the final services in the Whites Road property of the Bayside Baptist Church, when special services are planned for 10 am and 7 pm with a celebration tea at 5 pm.

After many years of use for services, first as a branch of Wynnum Baptist Church and later as part of the Bayside Church, the building has been sold and the church will relocate at the Wynnum West Church at present.

Plans are in hand for a proposed new development on the future site at 562 Wondall Road, Tingalpa. The manse now stands on this site and the future *church buildings should be adequate for the church's programme.*

HISTORY

The Whites Road Church had its beginnings between 1915 and 1916 with a small Sunday School conducted at Lota.

This was not continued and a gap of 35 years followed before a second Sunday School was commenced in the home of Mr and Mrs V Bennetts, opposite the present church building.

By 1955 the Sunday School had grown too large for the home and the church site was purchased. A temporary building was used for the Sunday School.

Under the ministry of Rev. E Edwards, the work progressed and the first evening service was held on 13th March 1955.

With the need for extra accommodation an old school building at Lota and an old dwelling at Darling Point were demolished by voluntary labour and eventually rebuilt on the site.

It was in use in 1958 opened by the then president of the Baptist Union of Queensland, Mr E S Jones.

Morning and evening services grew and in 1962 a local committee was set up to oversee the work.

In 1970 the Manly Church was combined with the Wynnum West Church to form the Bayside Baptist Church.

Rev. Kevin Clarke was called as Pastor and under his

leadership the work grew and the future site and names in Wondall Road was purchased.

The present Pastor, Rev. Errol Hosie commenced his ministry in May 1975.

It is anticipated that many old friends of the Church will attend and an open invitation is extended to all at the final services this Sunday.

COMBINE

On Sunday 25th January services will be combined with the Wynnum Church at 10 am and 7 pm.

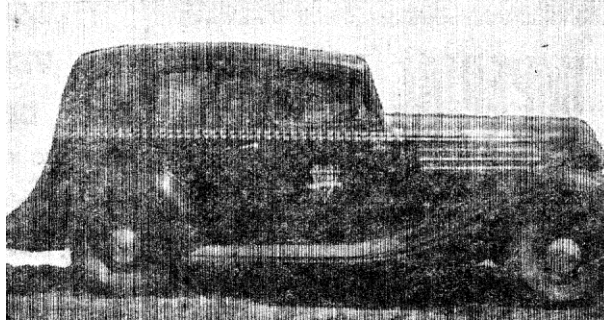
The following Sunday, 1st February the congregation of both the Wynnum West and Manly Churches will combine at Wondall Heights School at 10.30 am.

Sunday School will also be located there at 9 am. The evening service will be held in the Wynnum West building 2124 Wynnum Road, commencing at 6 pm.

Radio Cabs form part of Wynnum's History . . .



The business of phoning or calling a cab from the footpath of a city or suburban street is just a part of every day living in these modern times, but few people realize that the history of a local taxi service originated in the Wynnum-Manly-Lota district just after World War I back in 1920.

That business today is the Wynnum Radio Cabs organisation whose white vehicles with their green name insignia on the doors are known to thousands of people, not only in the Bayside, but from all over Brisbane.

It was from the Manly railway station that Mr Richard Russell senior first offered a transport service to the residents of the district with a horse-drawn carriage driven by his sons Messrs. Richard and Tom Russell.

Wynnum Central railway station was serviced by Mr George Heymer senior, also using carriages and horses which were driven by his sons.

At the Wynnum railway Mr Tom McKee picked up passengers who lived in the southern part of the then sparsely settled area.

Then as the motor vehicle came into being, Mr Tom Russell junior, Mr Alf Heymer junior and Mr Jack Paten obtained Fords and Overlands to cover their 'runs' while Mr Jack Paten put on the road a luxurious Willys Knight – at that time in the 1920's and still

resides at Prospect Street, Wynnum North – the ultimate in taxi cars.

As time moved on more modern sedan vehicles were purchased, telephones installed in the homes of the taxi proprietors who operated seven days and nights a week.

After Mr Jack Paten retired from the car hire business, Messrs. Alf Heymer and Tom Russell kept on the roads, while from time to time other men tried entering the car hire field but then long hours worked for small returns eventually forced them out.

THE FIRST REGENT

Towards the end of 1938 Mr Alf Cante bought a Regent cab – a 1935 Terraplane Sedan and plied for hire in the Bayside districts.

Alf's venture was successful and was taken over by his father, Mr Bill Cante and brother, Mr G Cante while Alf returned to his trade as a butcher at Manly and Wynnum Central.

Then in 1950 their taxi business was taken over by Mr Harry Pulley who added this business to his existing taxi

service and again about 1951 the then owners amalgamated their taxi businesses with Messrs. Parker and Wallace.

All the cars were fitted with two-way radios, an office and base was set up at Scales Building at the corner of Florence Street and Tingal Road and Wynnum Radio Cabs came into being with Messrs. Noel Scales and Bill Ansell, both taxi owners, becoming the directors.

CAME BACK

After relinquishing his butchering interests in 1958 Alf Cante went back into the taxi hire business and in 1962 he acquired the ownership of Wynnum Radio Cabs from Mr J Russell junior.

Alf increased the taxi fleet from 13 cars to 20 and offered a 24 hours daily service.

Today Alf Cante still owns one taxi unit and also drives occasionally while John Russell junior is still with the company.

In an interview with "The Herald" this week the delegate stated that all Wynnum Radio Cabs are owned by local owner-drivers.

“Our cabs are for local people for the convenience at all times and should we be hired to travel to other districts our cabs return immediately to their Wynnum base for further service for our Bayside public.”

“We still have with us members who have given 15 years and more of service to the people of our district through the Wynnum Radio Cabs. There are others who have been with us for up to 10 years.”

“Since Wynnum Radio Cabs came into being it has progressed from a small handful of men to a company that now employs a staff of 42 men and women all of whom reside in the Wynnum-Manly and surrounding district. The Staff consists of owners, drivers and radio-operators.”

their services to cover the Redland district. This has been brought about by Capalaba Cabs proprietor John Lean and Cleveland Cab Merv Barrett joining the Wynnum Radio network.”

“I have no hesitation in stating that as the years go on Wynnum Radio Cabs will continue to progress with our district – time has proven our service to be the best that can be offered – our history goes back to the old days of 1918 and the knowledge gained through hard experience down the years has been passed on to those who keep the familiar and popular radio cabs on the road today in 1976.”

“Wynnum Radio Cabs extend thanks to all their customers for their loyal support over the years.”

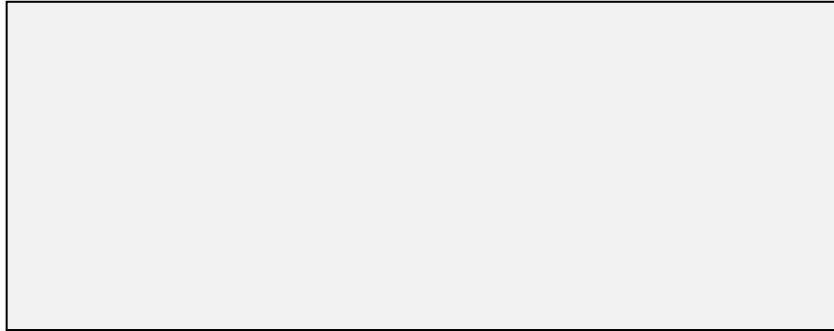
