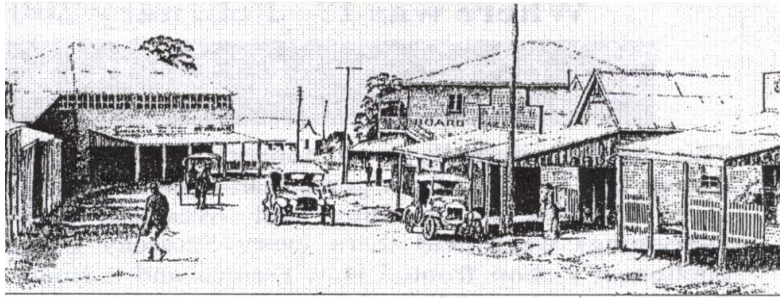

FROM THE PRESIDENT



The next coach tour on Saturday 24 September to the Boonah area is one not to be missed. We will enjoy a scenic drive down the Cunningham Highway turning off to Boonah. At Boonah we might have time to visit the local markets before leaving for the Donkey Farm. The Donkey Farm is special. Heike, the owner, is involved in the rescue of endangered animals and the donkey is one of those. Each donkey has a tale (no pun intended) and Heike tells their stories. The presentation, including morning tea, is about an hour, and then there will be time to say hello to the donkeys. A testimonial from a National Seniors tour group said the following:

We last visited the site in 2004 and I was impressed by their displays of artefacts, memorabilia and photographs. Since then, a display of historical costumes has been added. It will be well worth seeing. We will return to Brisbane via Kalbar, once called Engleburg after a local businessman of German descent. The name was changed to Kalbar during the First World War. We will point out some local landmarks as we pass through. Don't forget to be at the Civic Centre by 7.45am for an 8am departure. We will be home by 5pm.

I would like to thank our loyal members and friends who have been supporting our tours over the years. However numbers have been falling off. The last tour ran at a considerable loss due to lack of numbers. I realise considerations of health and other commitments sometimes plays a part. We try to keep the costs down by subsidising the price of lunch. The Society pays for this. I have booked a coach for fifty people. Please encourage your friends and relatives to attend so that we can keep our tours going.

The Oral History Project "Slates to iPads" was officially launched by Myrtle Beitz at our last meeting. - FROM LAST MONTH:- Where was this hall located in Lindum?



“ Lindum Progress Hall came alive yesterday (20/02/1979) when more than 40 of the area’s pioneers got together for morning tea. The Pioneer Day is an annual event organised by the Lindum Progress Association”

The Hall was located just over the railway line, second building on the left in Lindum Road. The Progress Association first met in 1948, and early meetings were in member’s homes. The

hall was in the mind of members from 1949 and was about to be built, with voluntary labour, in 1956.

Does anyone know when the hall was demolished?
And when did the Progress Association fold? fully operational by 1962

- Wynnum Municipal Hall (formerly Wynnum School of Arts)

You may remember, earlier this year, that the Brisbane City Council proposed “Wynnum Hall” as the new name for the renovated building. We had a vote at our General meeting and proposed “Wynnum Municipal Hall (formerly Wynnum School of Arts)”.

When you next travel southwards along Bay Terrace, please note the name, the name we suggested, is now mounted outside the building. There are new gardens and an Interpretive panel telling the history of the Hall.



Wynnum School of Arts

The School of Arts movement flourished in Queensland from the mid-nineteenth century, providing local communities with access to subscription-funded libraries, public education classes and meeting facilities.

The building of a School of Arts in Wynnum was first suggested in 1890, but residents began to raise funds from 1910. Henry Atkinson and Charles McLay, Brisbane architects, provided the design, free of charge and Manly builder, Peter Olsen, was contracted to erect the building. The hall was opened in December 1913 and from 1915 to 1918 housed the annual Wynnum and Manly School of Arts Show, forerunner of the Agricultural, Horticultural and Industrial Show.

During the first twenty years the building was altered and expanded, enabling its use as a concert and dance hall.

A substantial community library was developed, which in the 1940’s was integrated into the Brisbane City Council library system.

Over the years, with the provision of extended educational services, membership of the School of Arts movement declined. In 1977 the Wynnum and District Municipal Library was moved from the Hall to a new building in Wynnum Civic Centre.

The former School of Arts building, once the hub of the community, still retains an integral role in the life of the district.

RECLAIMING THE FORESHORES

Big Scheme for Wynnum

£78,000 INVOLVED

The decision of the Wynnum Chamber of Commerce to prepare, in conjunction with the Sandgate Progress Association, a scheme of foreshore reclamation, will link at the Wynnum-end with the agitation which commenced ten year's ago, when civil engineer (Mr L. M. Ord) prepared an elaborate plan, together with detailed specifications and estimates of costs. At the time the aldermen of the Wynnum Town Council, led by the late Mr. John Paterson, gave favourable consideration to the proposal, but the estimated cost, approximately £78,000 precluded the relatively small municipality of Wynnum, from taking the matter up as a ratepayers' liability.

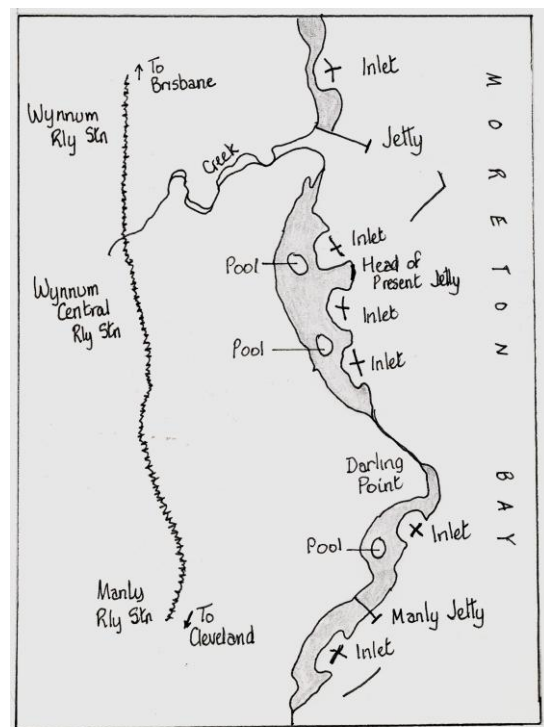
The scheme provided for swimming pools up to 20 chains in length at various points along the foreshore: boat harbours of similar dimensions and a network of driveways. Opposite Wynnum Central the proposed seawall would extend out as far as the head of the jetty. Actually three works were proposed, the first extending from Lytton to Darling Point, another taking in the inlets along the foreshore at Manly and the third extending to Loa Creek. The original plan of this scheme is in the possession of Mr W. H. Atkin, a resident of Wynnum for 30 years, who retired from the Public Works Department several years ago.

INCREASED SEASIDE FACILITIES

In 1927 the city planner (Mr. Earl) prepared a reclamation scheme, based on the plan prepared at Wynnum, and the committee appointed by the Wynnum-Manly Chamber of Commerce will base its inquiries on the available data. Increased areas for

sport, carnivals and children's playgrounds are to be considered.

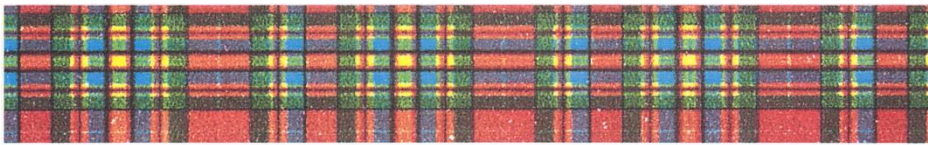
Mr H. D'Arcy Smith, president of the Manly Progress Association, who moved in the matter at the Chamber of Commerce meeting on Monday night, said yesterday that Brisbane as the capital city of Queensland, lacked sufficient seaside facilities for its



population, and although the bay resorts had unequalled beauty, there were great possibilities for further development. As a tourist attraction Mr. D'Arcy Smith suggested the erection of a lookout in a specially selected reserve on one of the heights of Manly, overlooking the bay. With the aid of a telescope, he said, a wonderful panoramic view of the bay and islands would unfold itself to tourists.

COMMERCE HINDERED

While the triple seaside resorts of Wynnum, Manly and Lota have made steady progress during the period which has elapsed since the inception of the Greater Brisbane Council, said Mr. George Geddes, president of the Chamber of Commerce, the expansion of commerce has not kept pace with the growth of the district. Commerce at seaside resorts, he added, is largely based upon tourist traffic, and local facilities for visitors have lagged behind the growth of the city and development of the Wynnum Manly District.

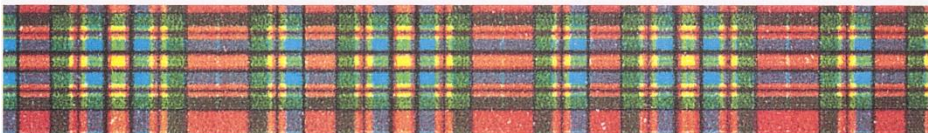

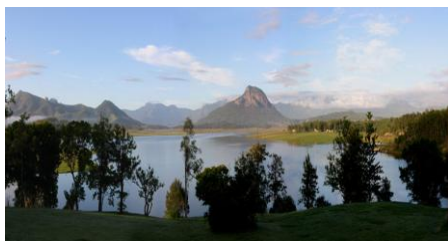

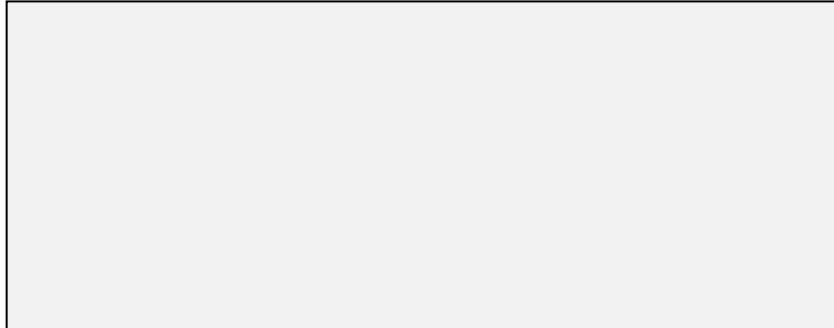
