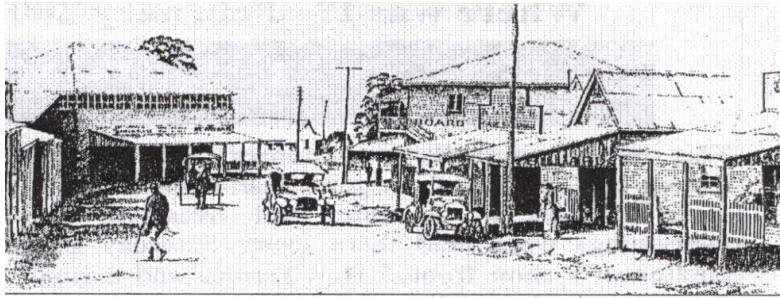

1924

The foundation stone of **Nazareth House** was laid on 13 April 1924 at 3.30pm.

1927

This excerpt from *The Brisbane Courier* on 26 April 1927 describes the Anzac Day Service in Wynnum that year:-

The twelfth Anzac commemoration service held at Wynnum South tonight was one of the most largely attended of any yet held. **The Star Theatre**, in which the service took place, was filled to overflowing, and stirring addresses were delivered by the **Rev. H. C. Wilson**, B.A., **Messrs. W. A. Barnes** and **W. H. Barnes**, M.L.A. A citizens' choir rendered special music, under the baton of **Mr. A. R. Hooper**, the following items being included, "The Heavens are Telling," "Be not Afraid," "Blest are the Departed," "And the Glory of the Lord," and "Hallelujah." **Alderman W. L. Dart** presided, and delivered a suitable address. As representative of the local sub-branch of the Returned Soldiers' League, **Mr. J. J. M'Connell** conveyed to the meeting a message, stating that his comrades desired to express their appreciation and thanks for the very solemn and appropriate commemoration service that had been carried out that night. He also stated that the league desired to pay a tribute to the citizens of Wynnum in meeting year after year on Anzac Day to pay homage to their deceased comrades of the Great War. During the service vocal and instrumental items were rendered by **Mrs. Gunderson**, **Mrs. Marion Wilson**, and **Mr. P. Taylor**. The Wynnum Band and Boy-Scouts paraded through the streets to the hall, and the band, under the baton of **Mr. Chas. Wood**, assisted in the service. At 9 o'clock Bugler **Harold Walmsley** sounded the "Last Post," which was followed by the choir singing, "Blest are the Departed."

Greetings.

2012 is almost one third over, and here we are already in April. The Romans considered this month sacred to Venus, and its name is thought to have been derived from that of her Greek equivalent Aphrodite. A more plausible derivation connects it with the Latin “aperire”, meaning “to open”, in reference to the unfolding of buds at this season in the Northern Hemisphere. The modern Greek word for spring (anoixis “opening”) provides a good analogy. Here, in the Southern Hemisphere, we are inclined to welcome some relief from the hot summer months.

Already this year, in the wider sphere, we have seen two significant historical events take place. Our Queen, Elizabeth II, celebrated 60 years since her accession to the throne on 6 February 1952. The only other British monarch to celebrate a Diamond Jubilee was Queen Victoria in 1897.

Also, we saw the LNP achieve a landslide victory in the recent Queensland elections. A good result for them, but an unhealthy result for democracy in Queensland, as there is such a weak opposition.

Our Society started off well with its first trip for the year to Beaudesert. Although numbers were a little disappointing, we enjoyed the open garden at Bromelton House, the Beaudesert Museum and the visit to Tamrookum Church. On the way home, as a special treat, we sampled dragon fruit scones at the Dragon Fruit Farm, Tamborine Village.

Already, we are starting to plan our next trip in June ... probably somewhere on the Sunshine Coast. Although the Society does at times subsidise these trips, we do try to make ends meet. Therefore, it is important to get as many as possible attending. This year has seen a further increase in the cost of bus hire (but what hasn't gone up!), so I would encourage as many as possible to attend, and support the Society. We will do our best to make it an enjoyable time.

If this year is anything like last year, when we had a glut of natural disasters, riots, etc., we need to be conscious of John Lennon's famous line “Life is what happens to you while you're busy making other plans”.

On that note, whatever the news brings, I think it's safe to make the prediction that, with the London Olympics, and the Queen celebrating her Diamond Jubilee, 2012 will be an interesting year.

Best wishes and here's to an exciting and fulfilling year ahead for the Wynnum Manly Historical Society.

Well cultivated Holdings

Prosperous Fruit Growing District

“Sixty five years ago (1875) then Manly district was bush . . . one of the earliest pioneers of the district was the late Mr J Emmott . . . in the first days of settlement sugar was the main crop, but the settlers found that the climate and soil were admirably suited to growing tropical fruits . . . water was obtained by boring almost anywhere in the district and most of the holdings have bores or wells . . . in the near future the farms will have the advantage of Brisbane water supply and also electric light”.

Listed are the early farmers of Manly – Emmott, Hardie, Young, Jones, Bruce, Mrs Bugg, Hinds, McCulloch, Walker, Platt, Elliott, Steele, Austin, Hogg, Marshall, Woodey, Locherry, Tyas, Wickham, Howell, Nickols, Heers and Turpin.
Do you know any persons with those surnames – maybe descendants? Let me know.

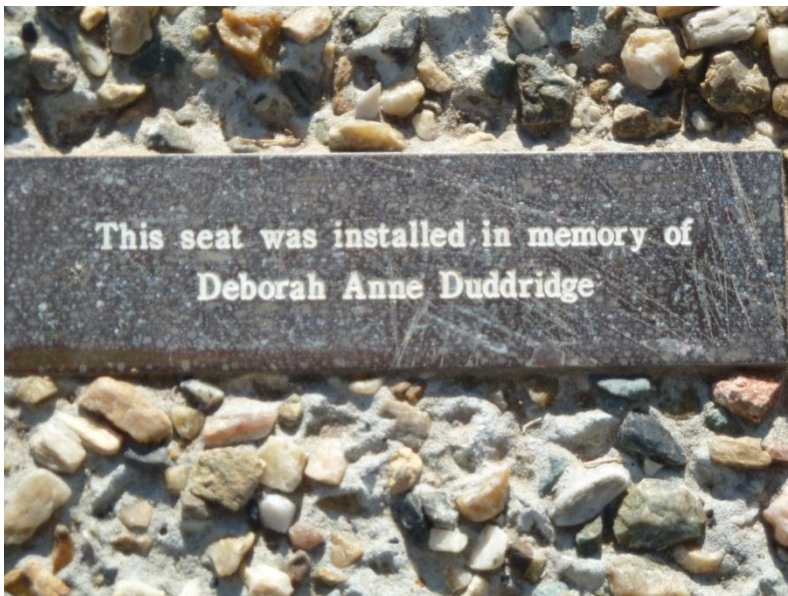

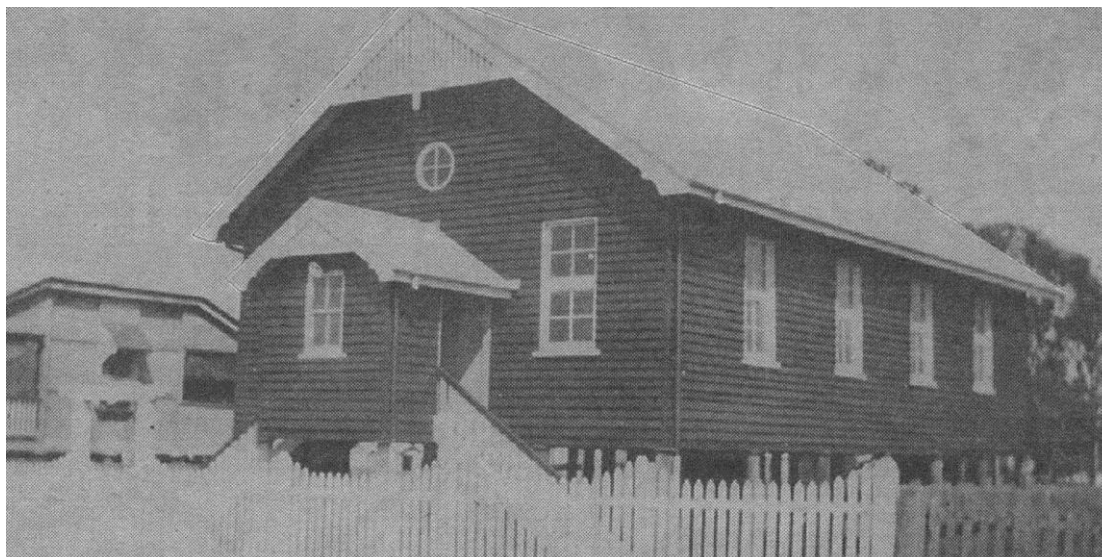

Assembly Testimony commenced at Wynnum in 1895 in the holiday home of Mr and Mrs Charles Payne who met with Mr and Mrs David Craig. David was the station master at Manly (or Lindum).

In 1897, Hugh Irvine moved his business from Bulimba to Bay Terrace, Wynnum and a small gathering of the Saints commenced in Mr Irvine's home above the shop. Those attending included Mr and Mrs H Irvine, sons Sam and Bert, Miss Sarah Irvine, (later to marry Arthur Payne) and Mr and Mrs David Craig.

As more people attended, the meeting was moved to the back of a shop belonging to a Presbyterian lady on the site of the Bank of New South Wales (now Westpac site). The next move was to the Gordon Club in Florence Street and meetings continued there until 1918, when a move was made to the School of Arts in Bay Terrace.

In 1924 a piece of land was purchased in Clara Street and a Gospel Hall was built. There were 114 persons in the Fellowship.



Gospel Hall in Clara Street 1924 - 1962

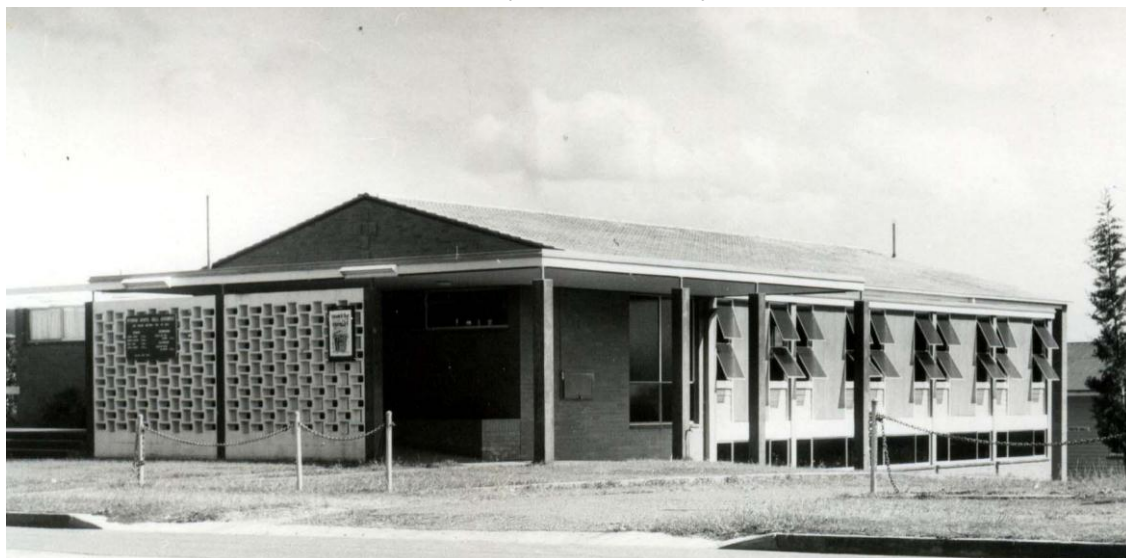
Sunday Schools for the children were conducted under the house of Mr F Walsh and in the garage of Mr Lew Abraham of Wynnum North. This led to the thought of another Gospel Hall at Wynnum North and in 1960 a Hall was completed. Another hall was opened in Gumdale in 1963.

When the church was considering building a new hall, during the time of lightening development in Wynnum, the property at Preston Road came up with a larger area of land and was purchased in 1960.

In 1962 the old wooden Hall was moved to the Preston Road property. The new brick Hall, capable of seating 400 persons was officially opened on 27 April 1963 by Mr Enoch Coppin – the New Zealand Author-Evangelist and Bible Teacher.

Wynnum Herald Wed 1 May 1963 reports on the:

“Official opening of the new building in Preston Road. 450 persons present. Building cost £20,000. The old wooden church building behind the hall was moved bodily from Clara Street and has been used until the opening of the new hall. Now the hall will be used for Youth activities. There are four Sunday schools, at Manly, Lota, Gumdale and Preston Road.”

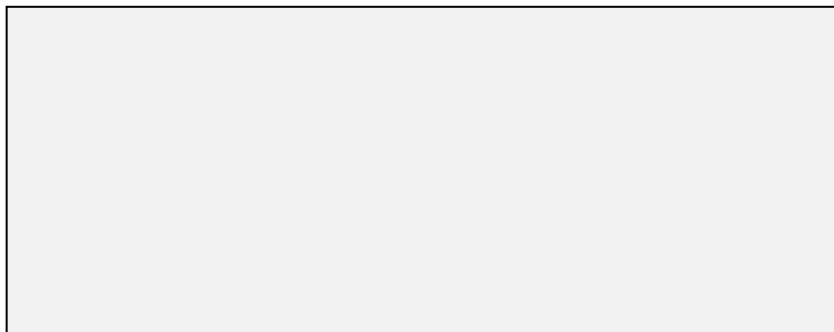
