


# **Presidents Report**

All for now, looking forward to seeing you at our next meeting.



#### ROTARY'S REST ROOMS NEAR COMPLETION

The current community project of the Rotary Club of Wynnum Manly is progressing favourably and will be completed within the next two weeks.

The Lord Mayor, Ald. Clem Jones, has offered to officially open the rooms on Saturday morning, February 24 at 9.30 am.

These rest rooms which are located in the Civic Centre, Bay Terrace (next to the council office) will be provided by the Rotary Club and conducted by the ladies of the Wynnum North Country Women's Association.

President of Rotary, Mr John Beames, said yesterday that the club's community service committee, under the direction of Mr George Lake, had prepared the rooms with the necessary requisites for the use of the women folk, particularly those with young children, for whom such a centre would provide a long needed public service.

### KIDNAPPED

A nine year old boy, Charles George Benjamin Hickman, residing with his mother and grandmother at Manly, Queensland, disappeared on Monday afternoon under sensational circumstances.

It appears that about 3.30 o'clock a motor car attracted the curiosity of several residents of the Wynnum district by reason of the fact that it had been specially closed in, apparently in order that the occupants should not be seen by passers by. The car proceeded along the roadway leading to the State School and stopped on reaching several children, including young Hickman, who were on their way home. A man said to have been wearing a mask alighted from the car, walked across to the boy, patted him on the head and shoulders and then suddenly picked him up and carried him into the car, which made off at top speed. Several persons who were in the vicinity heard the screams of a child as the car dashed past them and it is stated, noted that the driver of the car wore a mask.

The police were notified of the disappearance of the boy and endeavours were made to trace the car and its occupants, but so far, it is understood, no success has attended their efforts. Rightly or wrongly, an impression prevails in Manly that the boy has not fallen into the hands of strangers.
