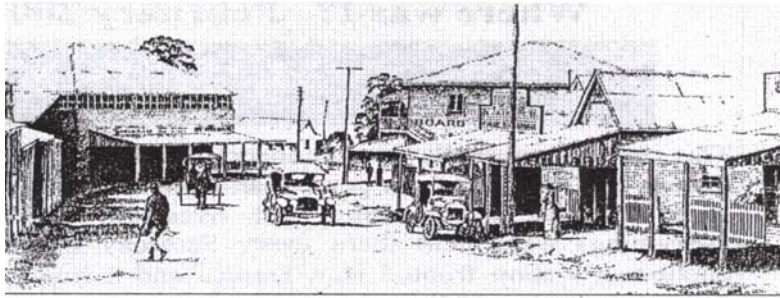

FROM THE PRESIDENT

The month of May is upon us and with it the beautiful Winter weather we associate with this time of year. I hope you all had a peaceful Easter. The holiday was unusual as we had a five day break with Anzac Day included. It was a good time to travel and catch up with family and friends. I spent Easter on Bribie Island, recovering from a bout of flu, and enjoying the relaxing atmosphere of the Island. On Anzac Day I attended the Dawn Service at Woorim on the ocean side of the Island. The turnout at 4.28am was large. It was good to see so many young people attending this event. I also visited the Bribie Island Museum, which we toured last year. The Museum is well worth a look if you are visiting the Island. I found out more about the incident at Skirmish Point, where Flinders came into conflict with the Aborigines over this hat. The story is well told on a digital display board which explained the events that took place on that day. Another place worth a visit is the Bribie Island Arts and Craft Centre. A Market Day is held there once a month and I was delighted to visit the numerous craft stalls while being entertained by the Island's Male Choir. The sense of community on the Island is wonderful and can be favourably compared with our own sense of community in the Wynnum Manly area.

The preparations are well in hand for our next Heritage Trip. We will leave Wynnum at 8.30am to visit the Mercy Centre Museum at All Hallows Convent. The display held there is extensive and the tour will take two hours which will include morning tea. At the conclusion of our visit we will travel to the Windsor Historical Society, which is housed in the old Council Chambers. We will have lunch there which will be provided by our members. Afterwards we will have a coach tour of the Windsor area with a guide from the Windsor Historical Society. We will return to Wynnum by 4.30pm. It promises to be a good day.

At our next meeting in May, the Main Speaker will be Andrew Ensbey, from the Brisbane City Council, who will talk about the upgrade of the "Lota Camping Reserve". It should be very interesting. Our Spot Speaker will be Margaret Dakin, a local playwright, who lives in the Redlands District. Margaret has written a play entitled "Presumed Guilty" which is about Ellen Thompson who was executed at Boggo Road Gaol on 13th June 1887, for the murder of her husband, Billy Thompson. She was the only woman legally hanged in Queensland. Margaret says of her play. "While audiences might remain undecided as to Ellen's guilt or innocence, I hope they will acknowledge that she lived her life with courage and heart." The play will be staged at the Wynnum Municipal Hall on Saturday 4th June 2011, with performances at 3pm and 7.30pm. Adults \$15, Concessions \$12. Tickets will be available at the May Meeting. The play will be professionally staged, with a strong cast including myself in the role of Ellen's husband, Billy. I hope to see you at our next meeting and at the play.

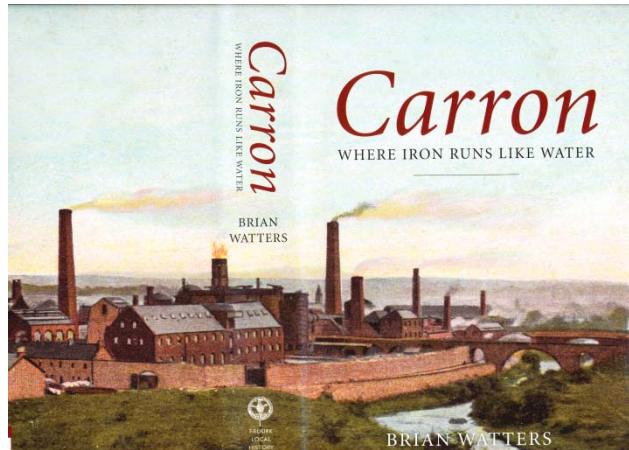

We had a visit from Ian Scott, a member of the Falkirk Historical Society last year.

This month we received a copy of “*Carron, where iron runs like water*” personally signed by the author Brian Watters.

The book provides a 450-page detailed account from the birth of the company in 1760 to its closure on 3 August 1982.

The Carron Works were once said to be the greatest foundries in Europe. And our Cannon, No.60756 located outside the Wynnum library, was manufactured there in 1800.

Hence the seaside resort of Wynnum. Are we to understand that this is actually how the name of Wynnum was derived?

Wynnum Town Council By-Laws (1912 – 1926)

No. 38 No driver or conductor of any vehicle, whilst within the town, shall make any noise by shouting, ringing of bells, blowing of horns or sounding other noisy instruments

No. 41 Whilst feeding his horse he shall use nosebags to contain forage and shall remove the horses blinkers.



Richard RUSSELL was the first cab proprietor in Manly.

Richard was born in Liverpool, England and arrived in Australia in 1872. He was a member of the Wynnum Town Council from 1915 and Mayor 1918 – 1920.. In 1919 Richard and other members of the Wynnum Agricultural, Horticultural and Industrial Society cleared the swampy “Russell Park” to create the Showgrounds. The park became known as Memorial Park when an avenue of trees was planted there after WWI in honour of soldiers who lost their lives in the War.

Richard died in 1949 the owner of 9 shops and about 25 houses. The triangular park in Ferguson Street, Manly was re-named Richard Russell Park in 1990.

George HEYMER

George operated two hansom cabs, one driven by his son Alf and the second by Mr Peachy. Drawn by two horses, these cabs would meet the trains and on weekends and holidays, take up to ten passengers at a time to the beach. The buggies were equipped with protection from the sun and carried brass lamps for night traveling.

George was a member of the Wynnum Town Council for No. 2 Ward from 1913 – 1915. He moved into the news agency on the corner of Tingal Road near to the Wynnum Central Railway Station, while his son Alf continued the taxi service. Business progressed from horse cabs to motorised taxis.

CORRECTION to Eccles Cakes recipe

Below is the correct recipe for Eccles Cakes. The butter was left out of the recipe in last month's newsletter.

8 ozs puff pastry
(or sheet pastry. Using a 3 1/2 inch diam cutter you can get six rounds out of a sheet of pastry)
6 oz currents
1 teaspoon mixed spice
1 oz soft brown sugar
Milk or a little beaten egg white
A little granulated sugar
2 oz butter

Set oven to 230 c . Cut 6 x 9cm (3 1/2 inch) rounds out of each sheet of pastry. Mix together the butter, currents, spice and sugar and place generous spoonfuls in the centre of each round. Dampen the edges of the pastry, draw up into the centre, like a parcel to enclose the filling and seal well. Turn over and flatten very lightly with a rolling pin. With a knife, make 3 slashes across the top of each cake, brush with milk or egg white and sprinkle with sugar. Place on a greased baking sheet and cook for 15 minutes or until golden. Serve warm with cream.

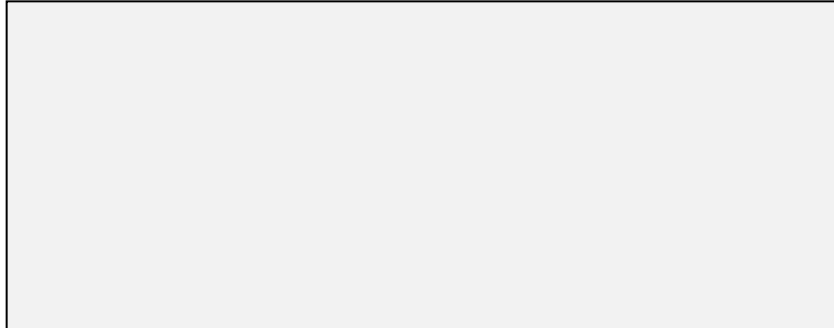
