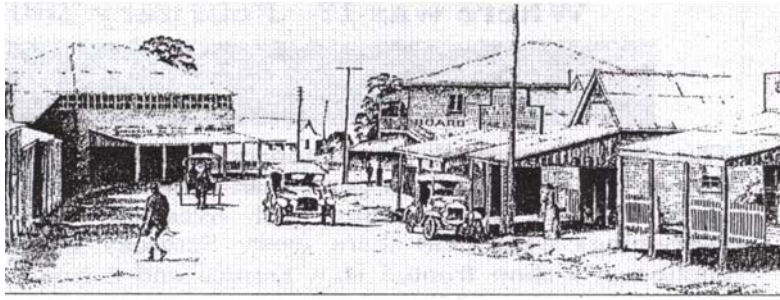

## FROM THE PRESIDENT



It is hard to believe that it is August already. It has been such a busy month so far. I missed the July meeting. I traveled to Glenmorgan via Dalby and Chinchilla with a visit to Roma, Surat and Goondiwindi. I had forgotten what a large state Queensland is and the distances we have to travel. The Warrego highway seemed to go on forever. The road was busy with large trucks and 'grey nomads' towing their caravans. The West has boomed with the mining industry. Dalby is a large town with traffic lights and parking meters. Unfortunately I was not able to visit Jimbour House, where Leichhardt began one of his explorations. At Roma I visited the Romavilla Winery, which was established in 1863, the oldest in Queensland. The "Big Rig" is also worth a visit. It contains a wealth of historical material on the oil and gas industry. At Glenmorgan I stayed in the Myall Park Botanic Garden. The garden was established by Dave Gordon and his wife, artist, Ruth Gordon. The garden contains many botanical species. It is possible to stay overnight. It was wonderful to sit by the fireplace and later go outside and view the stars. On the way home I visited Goondiwindi, the home of "Gunsynd" the famous racehorse. The Information Centre and historical museum is well worth a visit.

Our next trip to the Tramway Museum and Dayboro is on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> September. The Dayboro Historical Society is putting on lunch for us at the showgrounds. There will be a choice of sausages, pattie, bread roll, coleslaw/salad, two desserts and tea and coffee. I promises to be a hearty meal. Afterwards we will have a look through the town. The Information Centre contains a wealth of material, there is also an Art Gallery and Museum. The Dayboro area has a Wynnum connection to the Crouch and Larsen families. We will tell you more about that later. Afterwards we will visit the Dam at Lake Samsonvale before returning to Wynnum at 4.30pm. We have engaged Brian's Buses for the trip. The company comes with an excellent reputation.

On Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> July the WMHS had an Oral History Workshop which was led by Dr. Helen Klaebe from QUT. The workshop gave us some outlines on how to collect and collate our local history collection. We also learnt a lot about the most recent technological innovations on storing and presenting information. There will be a follow up meeting in early September. Anyone wishing to be involved please see myself or Sandy. Congratulations to Sandy for organising this successful workshop and to our members for providing a wonderful lunch.

Recently there has been some discussion about the "fire bell" from the old Wynnum Fire Station. At present it located at the Capuchin Friary. The friars have asked the WMHS to find a home for it. A few weeks ago I rang the area controller of the Fire Brigade. He was delighted with my enquiry and offered to transport the bell from its present location and restore it to its former condition. The committee of the WMHS has been invited to the Wynnum Fire Brigade Museum where the bell could be located to discuss this proposal. I will keep you informed of the outcome of our meeting. Many thanks to members who have come up with suggestions for the bell.

At our next meeting I will be the spot speaker for the night. I am going to talk about the National Service memorial at Darling Point. The memorial was erected to commemorate the four Wynnum National Servicemen who were killed in Vietnam. This is an appropriate time to give this talk as it is a day after Vietnam Veterans' Day formerly known as Long Tan Day. I recently visited Long Tan for Anzac Day and as a National Serviceman and a Vietnam Veteran I will be able to give you some background to the four National Servicemen and their memorial. Thanks to Gerry Cunneen for bringing this to my attention. Gerry has also made a DVD of the dedication ceremony last year. My talk will be followed by speakers from the National Archives.

I hope to see you all at the following meeting.

## NEWS FROM THE RESOURCE CENTRE – August 2010

- A question was asked last month – who was the trader on the site previous to Pete, The Furniture Man?

Pete, the Furniture Man closed his shop at 121 Bay Terrace, between “Dollars and Sense” and Hargreaves Real Estate, in June 2010. “Chemist Warehouse” moved in, in July 2010.

Peter Benson owned the furniture shop prior to 1989, for in 1989 he sold to Kevin and Jenny Eustace. Pete bought the shop back again from the Eustaces in 1998.

In earlier days the site is said to have been the home of BCC (Brisbane Cash and Carry), Hepburns (a clothing store) and the original shop of George Sands (Ironmonger) before George moved to the corner of Bay Terrace and Edith Street.

- The granddaughter of **Blanche PRYCE** is seeking her obituary, printed in the Wynnum Herald in late 1980's to early 1900's. Does anyone remember Blanche?
- An old cup has been found at Pleasantville, the “**Hurlock Cup**”, presented by Mrs F Hurlock.  
The winner of the “Minor Junior Aggregate” for “9.11.47 – 28.12.47” was “ I. Toplis”.  
Does anyone remember a Mrs Hurley or know to what “Minor Junior Aggregate” is referring?
- A request from Lynette Bosanquet (nee Gregory)  
“I am looking to find any old photograph or any information of my great grandfather **John GREGORY** who resided in Wynnum at Tingal Road. He was a store keeper in 1914, (retired storekeeper in 1927), at the corner of Tingal Road and Pine Street, near the railway overpass. He died in 1935 and with his wife Elizabeth and two daughters and his second wife Jane, is buried at the Hemmant cemetery.  
John Gregory was a keen lawn bowls player.”  
Can anybody help?
- A house named “**Ebenezer**” is said to have been located on the Esplanade. The **Driver** family lived in this house at one time.  
Does anyone know of the location of this house or more about the Driver family?
- The Mercy Heritage Centre, located at All Hallows Convent in Ann Street, Brisbane, contacted the Society enquiring about the “**Nun's Bathing Boxes** at Wynnum”. Apparently there were three seaside places where bathing boxes were constructed for use by the Sisters of Mercy, Wynnum being one of these. We were able to assist with a photograph of the local Nun's Bathing Boxes, formally located off the Esplanade at the foot of Pine Street.

The Capuchin Friars, a Catholic religious order arrived in the Wynnum district in 1945 and were invited to take responsibility for the Parish of Wynnum by the then Archbishop of Brisbane Rev James Duhig.

They built a new school which opened in 1952. St Laurence Seminary, initially an old weatherboard house built on 11 acres of land at the northern end of Tingal Road, was opened on 19 April 1955 to cater for the academic needs of students in the pursuit of philosophical and theological studies.

A new brick two-storey building was opened 27 April 1958.

From 1970 the building was the training centre for novices, who then moved to Sydney in 2000.

By 2002 the building was no longer needed and the building and grounds were sold for housing development. In 2004 the Capuchins purchased this house at **92 Walnut Street** and renovated it to become Our Lady of the Angels Friary and the new home of the Friars in Wynnum.

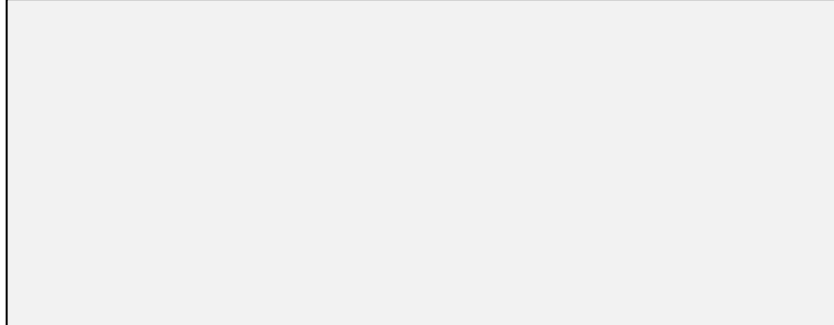
