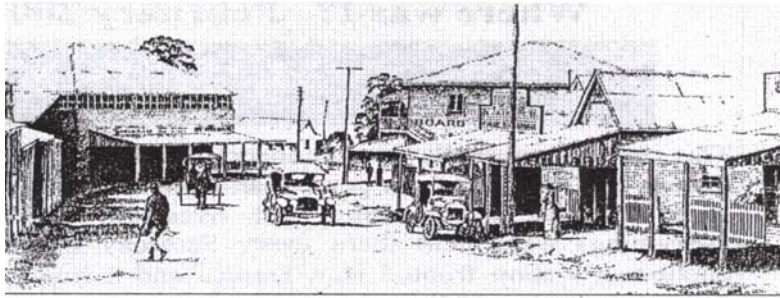

## FROM THE PRESIDENT



A few weeks ago I attended the Family and Local History Fair held at the Donald Simpson Centre at Cleveland. I arrived a little after 9am and the venue was already packed. A good sign. Jan Parnell, the treasurer for History Queensland, was on the door and was pleased with the turn out. The Local History Fair is held every two years and it is well worth spending the day there. There were guest speakers from the National Archives, the State Library and the Queensland State Archives as well as others. I attended a lecture by Paul Parton from the Church of Jesus Christ Latter Day Saints. As part of the Church's religious beliefs, they have compiled a huge archive of information on genealogy which is housed in their Research Centre in Salt Lake City, USA. A lot of work is also being done online. The lecture was about an ongoing project to record Church and Parish records in the Shires of England. I was fascinated by the talk and to hear that volunteers are needed to research information. You can combine it with your own efforts to trace family members. We should also be proud of the work being done by members of the WMHS to preserve our own local history.

One of the delights of the Local History Fair is to peruse the displays of other historical groups and talk about their efforts to preserve the past. Next to the display of the WMHS, which was very well attended, was the Boggo Road History Group. I purchased a number of books which told the story of this grim institution. I was also interested to find out that the group plan to conduct tours later in the year. This would be worth a visit. The Caloundra and districts history group had for sale a set of CD's about a group of Irish Famine female orphans who were sent to Queensland prior to separation. I also purchased a copy of Jarvis Finger's history of St. Helena. Jill also has a copy for the library. We have so much history here in Queensland and it is wonderful to see groups supporting it. I also made a stop at the Dayboro and districts stand. For our September trip we are going to visit the Tramway Museum, which we put off two years ago due to the tornado which devastated the suburb of the Gap. Jan Parnell recently suggested to me that we should go on to Dayboro. What a great idea. There are a number of things on in the town that weekend and the local history society has offered to cater lunch. An offer I couldn't refuse. More on that later. All said the Local History Fair, was a wonderful experience. I would like to extend our thanks to the History Queensland for organising it. I would also like thank Jill Greenhill and John McIntyre for organising the display for the WMHS. There was a great deal of interest in our group and many people who had an interest or connections with Wynnum visited the site.

The Nanango bus trip is coming up on Saturday 26th June. I am very excited about this trip. Thanks to Doug and Deborah Tearle we have a local connection. I spent a wonderful day recently with them taking to the people of Nanango. Lunch will be a Ringsfield House in the heart of the town where we will have a talk by local historian Liz Caffrey and be entertained by bush poets. Numbers are filling up fast so don't miss out. "History Alive" is to be held on Saturday and Sunday, 12,13th June at Fort Lytton. This is another event not to be missed.

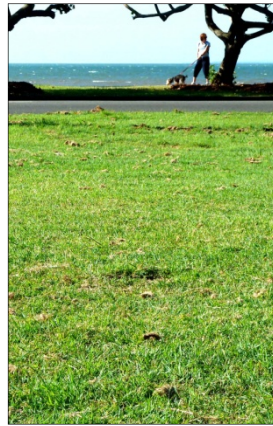

The Memorial is in the grass of Bandstand Park, opposite Picton Parade and half way between the Lower and Upper Esplanade. A tree, planted to mark the location of the memorial, has died.



The plaque was unveiled on the 27 January 1997 by the Rotary Club of Wynnum Manly, in remembrance of the 50th anniversary of the death of Paul Harris.

Paul Harris was the driving force behind the first Rotary Club in USA. Rotary had its humble beginnings in Chicago, when four friends met to solve the problem of unfriendly trading practices that were the vogue of the first decade of the twentieth century. They felt a need for some one to foster a climate of goodwill and respect amongst business and professional men.

By 1911 clubs had been formed in Canada, England and Ireland as well as east and west coast of America.

The Carron Company was Scotland's first large scale industrial concern and by far the most important industrial employer in the Falkirk area for many decades. The company was liquidated in 1982 leaving a legacy of over 200 years of iron-making history.

In November 1759 a small group of ambitious businessmen came together with the intention in the "art and business of smelting iron ore and ironstone and casting the same into cylinders . . . bar iron . . . rods . . . plate iron . . . and other tools whatsoever."

The works were erected on the banks of the River Carron, near Falkirk and firstly known as "Roebucks, Garbett and Cadells" after the partners, but within a few years they became known as 'Carron'.

Dr John Roebuck, from Sheffield was a trained chemist, first at Edinburgh and then at Leyden in Holland. Samuel Garbett was a practical businessman based in Birmingham. This is where the two men met and collaborated in refining gold and silver. They moved to Scotland, and firstly established a works to produce sulphuric acid at Prestonpans. Here they met William S Cardell, who was already a wealthy shipowner and merchant and had tried unsuccessfully to produce iron on his own estate. Instead he was importing iron from Scandinavia. He encouraged his new friends to set up the ironworks at Carron.

William Cardell's son, also William, became the first manager and was largely responsible for bringing the works into existence on the ground. Dr Roebuck improved the quality and quantity of the output and in 1762 patented a method of manufacturing malleable (wrought) iron using pit coals.

Within 20 years the Carron Company employed thousands and the output was enormous making the company a world leader. The Company was an early user of the James Watt's steam engine. Samuel Garbett established a shipping company to transport the Carron products to distant markets. His son Francis became manager and soon built up a fleet of ships. Carron built its own canal to transport goods between the works and the River Carron. The Company had its own collieries, brickworks and quarries.

In 1773 the Company was granted a Royal Charter for its contribution to providing employment and extending the exports of Great Britain.

Construction of a rail network in central Scotland in the 1840's expanded the opportunities and in 1860 a railway bridge over the river joined the works directly to the main lines.

In the 1880 the original Carron site was completely re-organised and the blast furnaces re-built to make production more efficient. In 1901 Carron expanded dramatically with the construction of an engineering department and an additional foundry, Mungal Foundry, south of the river.

Production reached its peak during World War II when 98% of production was of highest priority for the Ministries concerned with the war.

Carron Company was 200 years in 1959. In 1960 a contract was awarded to supply segment castings for the Clyde Tunnel followed in 1961 with a similar order for the Tyne Tunnel worth £2m.

Engineering was becoming more specialised and plastics were replacing cast iron, especially in many household items. The Engineering Department closed in 1969, the Mungal Foundry in 1976. 1979 was the last profitable year for Carron. In August 1982 the receivers were called in and share dealings on the Stock Market were suspended.

From the ashes arose three companies, Carron Phoenix, Carron Plastics (1982) and Carron Steelyne (now Shires). The old factory buildings were leveled and all that remains is a small part of the front brick façade, kept as a memory of the past..

The society's interest in Carron - Wynnum's Cannon, standing outside Wynnum Library was manufactured at Carron in 1800 and our Secretary Lena McCreadie, once was an employee in the office of the Carron Company, Falkirk.

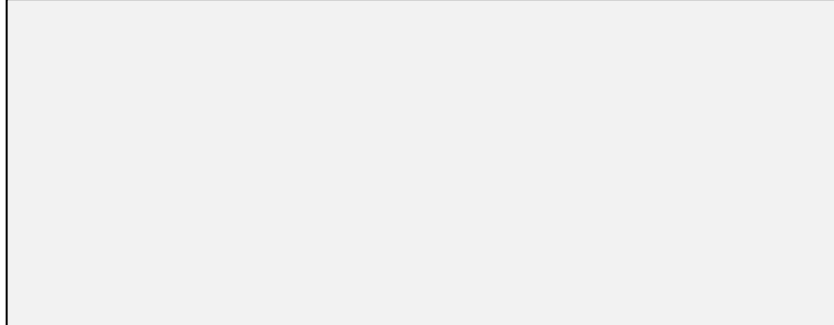
