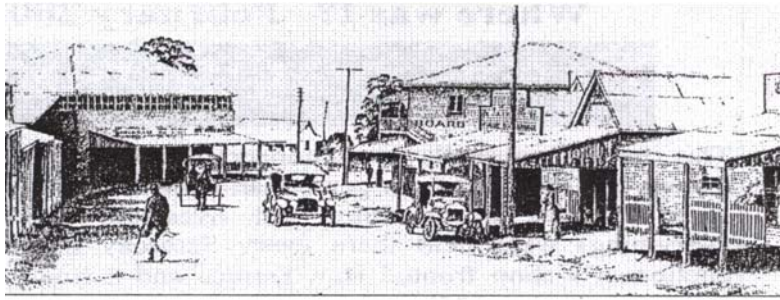

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Our second newsletter for the Year. How fast time goes.

Plans for the concert "Echoes from the Past", a celebration of the 96 years of history of the Wynnum School of Arts, or Municipal Hall, are well underway. Various Groups who have used the Hall are taking part. These include the Wynnum Choral Society and Savoyards. Mercury and Harlequin Theatres will also be represented. Plus, there will be items from the Momentum choir, Caprice dancers and the Ormiston Pipe Band. The Writers of Wynnum have also written a number of poems for the concert. It promises to be a wonderful afternoon of entertainment. It will be held at the Wynnum Municipal Hall, Cnr Bay Tce and Cedar Street on Saturday 23rd May from 2pm to 4pm. Tickets are \$10 including afternoon tea. They can be purchased from the Resource Centre (opposite the Wynnum Library) from 10am - 12pm Monday to Friday. They will also be on sale at our next meeting.

Our next History trip is on Saturday 28th of March. We will be going to Crows Nest, via Esk. It is a beautiful drive over the Great Dividing Range. At Crows Nest we will visit the "Carbethon" Folk Museum and Village. Lunch will be at the Farmers Arms Tavern, a fifteen minute drive from Crows Nest. I look forward to seeing you on our next trip. Please be at the departure point at least 10minutes before we leave.

Other matters of interest which I mentioned in the last newsletter concern the Manly Pool. The Pool will close after Easter. A new pool will be constructed which will be 25 metres instead of the present 33 1/3yards (30 metres). I have been trying to have a letter published in the "Wynnum Herald" to gauge public opinion on this change. If you have a view please contact me.

I also mentioned in the last newsletter about the closure in the near future of a number of local schools. To date, an announcement on what will happen to the schools has not been made.

Remember, we are always looking for local people with stories to tell. Please contact the Society if you have one, or know of someone who would like to be interviewed.

The next meeting will be our Annual General Meeting. It is hard to believe that a year has passed since the last one. So much has happened, which I will give a full report on. - The response to the request for information about the Roller Skating Rink was tremendous. We now have a photograph of Arthur Johnson, pictures taken inside the rink and many newspaper cuttings about events that occurred there between 1958 and 1962. **But we still do not have a photo of the outside of the building.**
- Although the Society is preparing for an event in the Wynnum Municipal Hall in May, thoughts have gone out regarding the fate of the Lota School of Arts. We have a photograph of the stump capping ceremony in 1926 when money was collected to build the hall. The Police Youth Citizens Club took over the running of the building from the community, in 1966. In 1973 the old School of Arts building was demolished and the new PCYC Building constructed. **Does anyone have a photograph of the Lota School of Arts, described as:-**

“a building resembling a church with a wide set of steps leading up and narrowing as they approached the front door” Inside the front entrance there was a small foyer and then more steps leading into the Hall?

- We thank Anne Westlake for the donation of book concerning the Lane family from Hemmant. The family arrived in Australia in 1857 and purchased land at Tingalpa, between the Ox-Bow Lake and the Brisbane River in 1859. Details are given of all the descendants of Eli and Harriet Lane (nee Hellier) and Solomon and Eliza Lane (nee Hellier) from early times until nearly the present day.
- Memorabilia are arriving concerning the former activities of the School of Arts (Municipal Hall) Wynnum. (Did you see the Society’s advertisement. in the Wynnum Herald of 4th March?) Doug Brewer provided some programs for Miss V Campbell’s Music School concerts in the early 1950’s We see that Noela Stratton (nee Charlton) played a duet with her sister Nancy.

Member Molly Hinchliffe has given the Society some old programs, run off on an old Gestener machine, of early Mercury and Savoyard productions. Molly’s husband, Ted, besides sometimes being a member of the cast, also was handy with stage constructions.

- A pen-picture of a person’s life is often portrayed in their Obituary. Our latest project is to making a collection of Obituary, Vale, Farewell, etc. Notices in the local newspapers. We do have easy access to the Wynnum Heralds from 1946 to 1967, but if you have any family cuttings stored away that are relevant, please could we obtain a copy.

A big thank you to all the volunteers who, each weekday, enable our door to be open from 10.00am to 12 noon.

Manager of the store was, " Mr Robert W Joy, who has been associated with the boot and shoe retail business both in England and Australia.. He will be assisted by Mrs Sylvia Joy and a local staff of Mrs Shirley Williams, Miss Zenette Jennsen and Mr Norman Bahr. Shoes will be displayed on self-selection tables for speedy shopping."

The other front shop of the Arcade was occupied by the "Edith Street News" run by Mr Peter Smith.

OUR PIONEERS – THOMAS HEINRICH VON SENDEN (THOMAS HENRY SENDEN)

The Society has a continuing project, which began several years ago, to collect information on persons residing in Wynnum, Manly, Lota and District before 1912. In 1912 Wynnum became a Town in its own right and there were only a few hundred persons residing there. This month we feature:

(THOMAS HEINRICH VON SENDEN)

THOMAS HENRY SENDEN (1881 - Retired in 1946)

Thomas Henry Senden's family arrived in Queensland in 1864 aboard the "*Peter Godeffroy*". His father Thomas Auguste von Senden and mother Christina Frederika Lovenzen migrated from Schligswig Holstein, then located in southern Denmark. Auguste and Christina married in the Lutheran Church, on the banks of the Logan River, in 1872.

Although a skilled artisan and master carpenter, Thomas Auguste owned sugar farms at Mount Cotton and a sugar mill. In 1875, he helped build the original Lutheran Church on the Mount Cotton Carbrook Road. In 1881 he was the local Postmaster. Thomas Auguste was said to be the only farmer who paid his Kanaka labourers, so he could not afford to update his equipment. He went bankrupt in 1885



Thomas Henry

Thomas Henry was born at Mt Cotton in 1881. He married Victoria Julia Squires in 1908 on the Thompson's Estate (Greenslopes). He was a store keeper in Albion until moving, in 1911, to Manly. His first store was on the corner of Cardigan Parade and Stratton Terrace. Within two years the family had moved to Cambridge Parade (on the site of the present Manly Hotel car park). The next move was to Mrs Paton's property, on the site of the Manly Mall. Finally in 1923 the family returned to the store in Cambridge Parade.

Early grocery days saw much hard work. Chaff had to be collected from Manly Station by horse and cart. Kerosene for lighting and stoves was sold in 4 gallon drums. Deliveries as far away as Capalaba and Mt Cotton Road were by horse and cart. Thomas Henry bought the first motor delivery vehicle in the town, a Ford "One-Tonner". In 1930 Thomas Henry installed the first refrigeration unit in his shop.



Victoria

Thomas Henry was Superintendent of the Manly Methodist Sunday School. He was a lay preacher. His wife Victoria led the girls in the church. He was President of the Manly Concert Band in the 1930's and President and Committee member of the Manly Progress Association.. He was a keen boating man and fished behind Green Island. His was one of the twenty boats anchored of the beach at Manly, many years before the thoughts of building a boat harbour.

Thomas traded until 1946, when youngest son Harold, after his discharge from the 15th Battalion, took over the business. Henry sold out in 1956 to Manahan's Chain Grocers and opened a fruit business. Harold passed away in 2000 but was a hard worker in the 1982 Manly Centenary Celebrations and a keen member of our Society.
