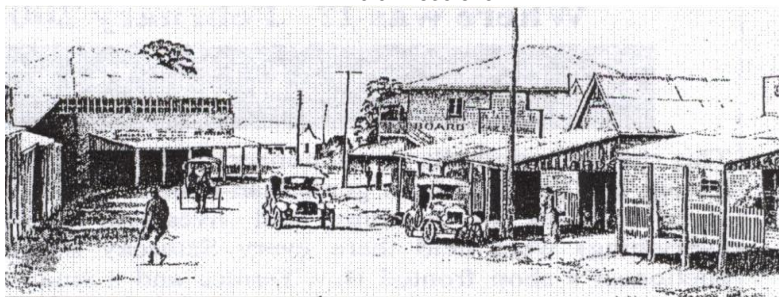

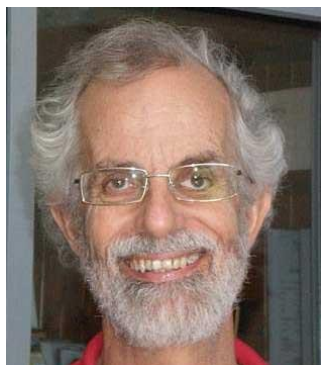

Following in her usual theme here are a few events from the month of June through history.

Locally:

1986 and crowds gathered to watch the flooding of the recently enlarged Manly boat harbour only to be dismayed that it was to be accomplished by pulling a stopper from a pipe and not the hoped for knocking down of the seawall! I was there!

1935 The Hayles Cruises Kiosk slid into the sea at Amity after a night of erosion.

1917 The yearly fee for a private bathing box was set at 10/-.

1890 The Manly dam site was inspected by Mr Williams, the Assistant Engineer, whose report was against enlarging it despite the fact it was prone to overflowing and causing havoc in Manly Township.

In the larger world:

1812 18th of June was the Battle of Waterloo.

1859 Mildred Hill, American musician was born. She composed the melody to what is now the world's most sung song "Happy Birthday to you".

1944 6th June D-Day landings in France by approximately 1.5000,000 Allied servicemen and women.

1997 30th June saw the handing back to China of Hong Kong after a 99 year lease by Britain.

Since last meeting we have had a very successful and enjoyable boat trip on the river and a most interesting weekend display at Fort Lytton supporting the many enactors recreating military life through the ages. Complete with authentic dress and campsites. Many of them spend the weekend there. Thank you to our stand volunteers and especially Ian Wheeler and Jill for setting up the display, which was in theme, featuring the history of the canons gifted to Queensland by Queen Victoria for the defence of the State.

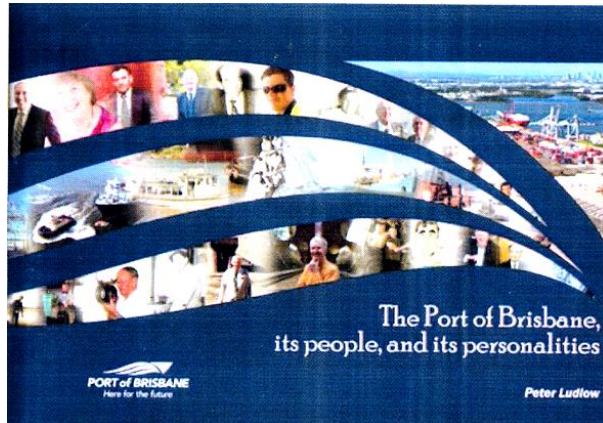

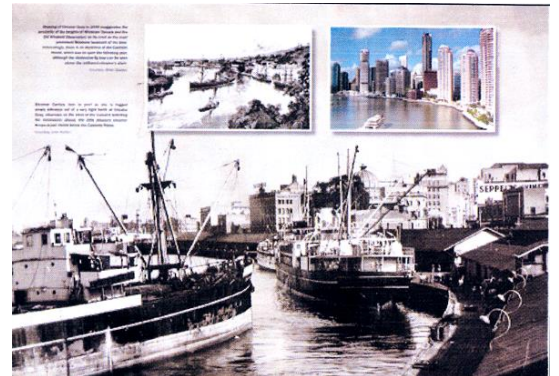

Part 1 covers the history of the river from Aboriginal ties to the present day. Part 2 is told in the words, and images of those who were involved in the growth of the port and Part 3 is the port at Fisherman Islands. There is a time line, an index and biographical references.

Former member Peg Borg now lives in Nazareth House, but unfortunately now does not recognise any visitors.

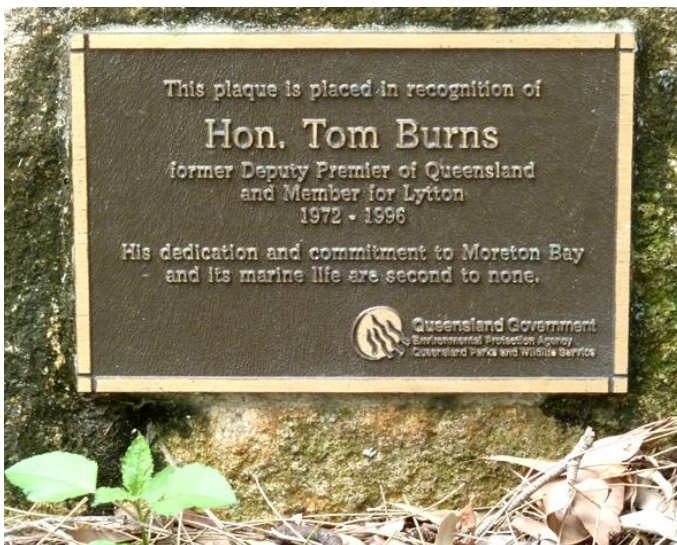

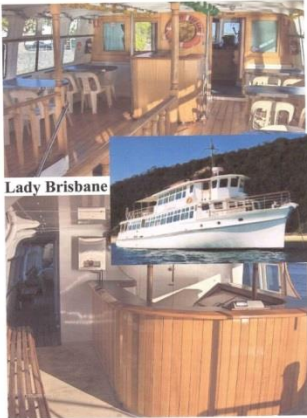

Brisbane Cruises



Due to the success and enjoyment had by all during the Society's recent cruise on board the MV Lady Brisbane, and also members and visitors expressing interest in undertaking further cruises, we thought we would let members know about some upcoming cruises being offered by this company. All these cruises depart from and return to Bretts Wharf at Hamilton. There is parking near Bretts Wharf at Hamilton or alternately you may opt to drive to Bulimba and catch the City Cat across the river to Hamilton.

Below are the cruises that may be of interest:-

Brisbane to Gold Coast – Sunday, 11 August 2013 – 9am – 5pm

A breathtaking calm water cruise past 300 islands, Tiplers Resort, Sovereign Islands, Couran Cove, Broadwater, Jumpinpin, Moreton Bay Marine Park and the Brisbane River. Watch for marine life such as dugongs, dolphins, turtles and sea eagles.

Includes morning/afternoon tea, BBQ lunch and return coast from Marina Mirage to Brett's Wharf, Hamilton.

Bremer River – Sunday, 6 October 2013 – 9am – 4pm

It all goes with the Spring Parade and Wynnnum atmosphere.

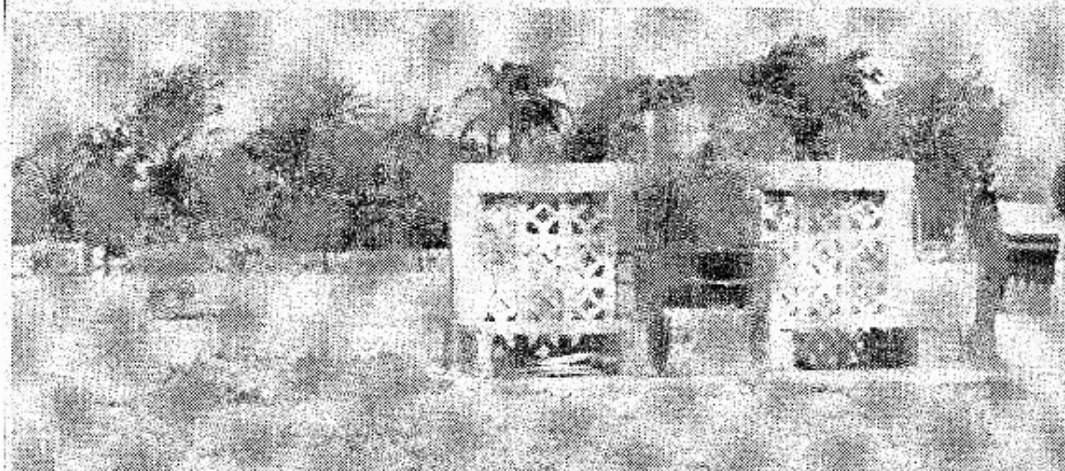

Russ Barton (1881—1954)

After suffering ill-health for the last few years, Russell Dumas Barton passed away on August 8 1954 at the age of 73 years.

A veteran of the 1914—1918 war, Russ enlisted in Toowoomba in 1915 and was overseas until 1918 with the 11th Field Company Engineers. With his wife and six children he came to live in Wynnum in 1923 and lived here until his death.

He was with the Repatriation Commission for 18 years until his retirement. Russ will long be remembered for the active part he took in civic affairs, for his friendliness and hospitality.

He was one of the early stalwarts of the Wynnum Sub-branch RSL and was treasurer for some years.

A foundation member of the Wynnum Heights Progress Association formed in the 1920's, he was mainly responsible for re-forming it in 1947. It has now become the active Wynnum Progress Association.

Russ Barton was an active worker for the Wynnum Ambulance in its early years.

With his family and helpers he constructed a tennis court and founded the well-known Sylvan Tennis Club which operated for many years and assisted materially the popularity of this sport in the 1930's.

His brother Vic pre-deceased him by 2 months at the age of 77 years.

Russ is survived by his widow Mrs M M Barton and six children, Messrs Aub, Ken, Joe and Ted Barton, Mrs E Heath and Mrs C Walmsley.

Ken Barton (1915—1991)

One of Wynnum's most respected businessmen, Ken Barton died earlier this month, (February 1991) after etching himself as one of the backbone pioneers of business in Wynnum.

The community worker with a passion for his sport, work and cars, died at the age of 76 after a long battle with cancer.

He had been a Wynnum resident for 68 years.

Mr Barton was one of a handful of men credited with building up business and an identity for the area to take it from one of the backblock suburbs of Brisbane to its relaxed, up-market lifestyle image of today.

Russell Kennard Barton came from humble beginnings, the third son of a family of six children born in Toowoomba.

In 1923 the Barton's moved to Waterview Street Wynnum Heights and Ken Barton attended Wynnum Central State School and then St Lawrence's College in Brisbane.

He soon built himself a reputation as a keen sportsman. He was a competition tennis player and member of the three-times premiership winning "A Grade" Wynnum Imperials rugby league side.

As a young man he had a passion for cars and pestered his friend to get him a job at Wynnum's Austral Motors.

He finally gained an apprentice motor mechanic position but left it for the air force when World War II started.

Mr Barton quickly rose to Flight Sergeant and served in Papua New Guinea.

It was during the war that he met and married dance instructor Dolly Weiss, whose family also had settled in Wynnum.

The couple bought their first home for £75. They had three children, Loyola, Douglas and Raymond (now deceased).

After the war Mr Barton still kept his passion for cars and with friend Alf Giles, a wheelbarrow full of tools and a backyard of a home in Walnut Street, the pair established their first business – G and B Motors.

In 1946 they set up shop in a service station leased from Shell.

Two years later the men had raised enough money to buy land across from the Waterloo Bay 50's and Over Leisure Centre (not far from the present site of Doug Barton Holden).

Mr Barton's son Doug said he could remember his father working tirelessly to buildup his business, sometimes from 7am one day to 4am the next day.

In the following years Giles and Barton bought and sold real estate in the area, finally ending up at the present Tingal Road site in 1972.

John Harrison joined the men and business expanded to attract people from throughout Brisbane.

In 1978 Giles sold his interests and Mr Ken Barton retired from the business in 1981 to make way for Doug to join it with John Harrison. Doug later bought out Harrison.

Dolly Barton 1919—2005

Wife of Ken Barton

One of the icons of Wynnum's musical past died late in 2005 at the age of 86.

Better known as Dolly, Mrs Barton moved from Oakey to Wynnum at the age of two and lived in the home and shop opposite the Imperial Theatre on the corner of Florence Street and the Esplanade.

She attended Guardian Angels School at Wynnum and took great interest in the sandcastle- building competitions held on the Wynnum foreshore.

Recognising her natural talent for dance, Dolly's family managed to send her to a dancing school, helping cultivate one of the great passions of her life.

From beginnings in amateur performances in the Imperial Picture Theatre, her big break came when she was chosen to dance and sing at the Cremorne Theatre, She became a permanent dancer at the theatre and worked with stars including Moe Rene and Bob and Dolly Dyer.

Dolly married Ken Barton, founder of what is now Doug Barton Motors, at Guardian Angels in November 1941.

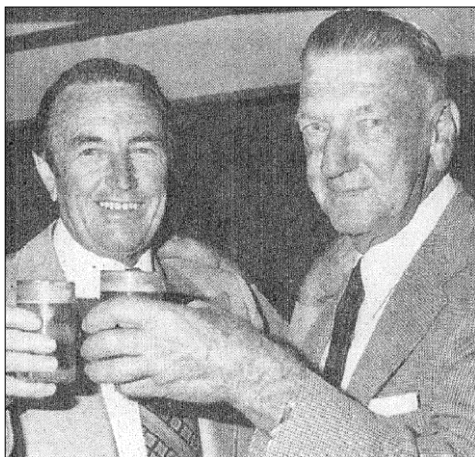
During World War II she established the Dolly Weise School of Dancing with, at its peak, 132 students.

Her concerts held at the Wynnum Star Theatre were remembered for many years. Dolly later became an accomplished choreographer, producing shows such as The White Horse Inn and concerts for the local Lions club.

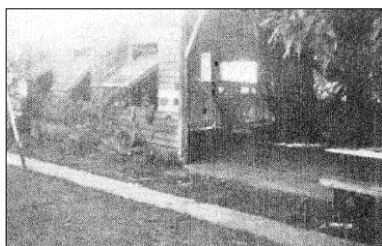
She went on to be a regular eisteddfod judge.

Dolly and Ken Barton had 3 children, Loyola, Doug and Raymond, nine grandchildren and 1great grandchild.

John Coupland gave the progress of the Fire Station Bell with photos to be available at the Heritage Morning Tea.
Nena Robertson enquired as to the ownership of former Mt Carmel Convent, as the building is for sale again.

Spot Speaker: Myrtle told of the history of the location of the Port of Brisbane, the early choice being Cleveland, due to the shallow entrance to the Brisbane River. But Cleveland was also renowned for its mud. Eventually the entrance to Brisbane River was dredged to provide the location of the port today.

Guest Speaker: Daniel Cheverton told the story of **Hugh Cameron McMinn**, local state labour member from 1915 – 1918. McMinn, from Scotland, was prominent in early Labour Unions and took the seat from Walter Barnes for one term.

The Raffle was won by Elaine Rogers, the Door Prize by Roisin Burrell and the Members' Draw by Wendy Smith.

The meeting closed at 9.15pm, and members retired to a delicious supper provided by Christina R-Woodhouse, Noela Stratton and Debbie Tearle.

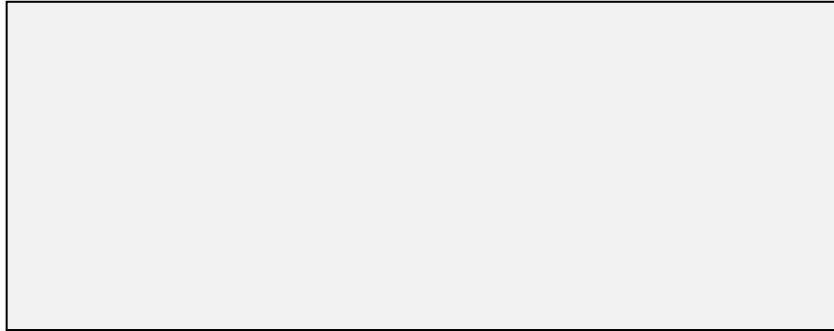
