
Where was I? June 2007



Resource Centre Report June 2007



Opening of the new Lota Rail Bridge

On Saturday, 23 June 2007 some lucky people rode an old seam locomotive, DD17 1051 commonly known as "The Blue Baby" to attend the official opening of the new rail bridge.

The Society approached Paul Lucas, last year, and asked if some of the timbers from the old bridge could be saved and turned into a memorial to the old bridge.

Luckily, we were just in time and some of the timbers were used to create a foot bridge over the creek and two of the uprights were left in situ.

It's quite a surprise to see the difference in height between the old and new bridges.

The new bridge has been named after Ken Biggs who had been a devoted member of the Australian Railway Historical Society since 1962.
