Myrtle Beitz spoke on the history of tennis in the district and **Heather Smith** gave an illustrated talk about the life and career of Lord Kitchener.

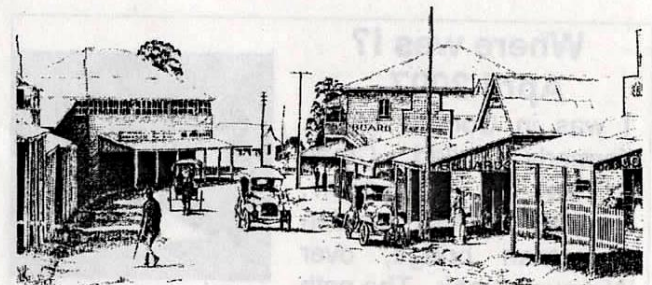
The **Lucky Door Prize** was won by Lena McCreadie, the **Raffle** by Lyla Feige and the **Membership Draw** by Col Brown.

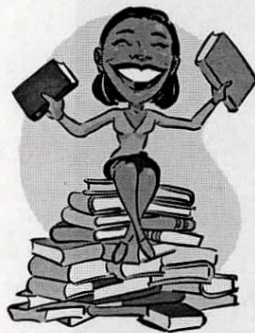


Resource Centre Report

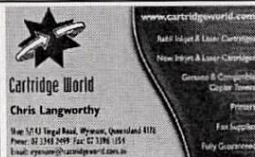
As a fundraiser for the Historical Society, we will be holding a bookfest which
