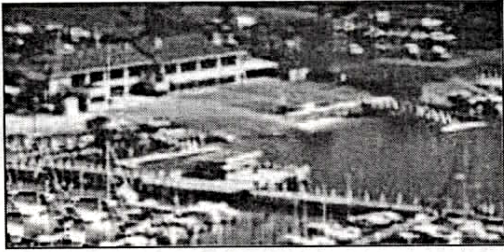

Moreton Bay Trailer Boat Club



When keen boaties, Bill Lamond and John Harper placed a small advertisement in the Wynnum Herald in early 1960, they didn't realize that they would be creating a major local identity.

A meeting of what was to become the Moreton Bay Trailer Boat Club, took place at John Harper's Service Station in Tingal Road.

The first committee was: Bill Lamond - Chairman, John Harper - Secretary and Lance Nichols - Treasurer.

After their second meeting on 6 June 1960, Club pennants in the colours of black and gold were ordered.

Within weeks, a fishing competition was organised as was familiarisation tours of Moreton Bay. A regular newsletter was sent to all members advising them of the planned outings

After obtaining Government approval, the small group used railway sleepers to built a boat ramp at Wynnum Creek.

By October 1962 the Club was looking for land to build a boat house with private launching facilities. They wrote to the Brisbane City Council about land at the mouth of Wynnum Creek but nothing eventuated.

However, reclaimed land at Manly Harbour became available for lease from the Department of Harbours and Marine.

In July 1973, a six lane boat ramp was laid and a Security fence was constructed around the property. Additional land was acquired in July 1974.

On 22nd March 1975 by the then Premier of Queensland, Sir Joh Bjelke Petersen, opened a two storey Clubhouse which was built by Ernest Day & Co. Five years later, the clubhouse was doubled in size.

In 1993 the MBTBC Marina was officially opened and on 18th March 2000 Honorary Life Members George Davie and John Harper opened the newly refurbished and air-conditioned Clubhouse.

John Harper became the longest serving Commodore of the Club and first Chairman of the MBTBC Marina Company.

The MBTBC is regarded as a world class marina and boasts 215 berths ranging from 10m to 17m mono and multi-hull berths, hardstand area, laundry facilities, fuel and gas.

It has a current membership of approximately 3500
