

#### The Lost Creek

In the early 1860's, Thomas Jones had purchased the first lot on Waterloo Bay (Lot 77). Before he built his house, Wyvernleigh, he cleared a track down the slope through the bush from the corner of Gordon and Mountjoy Terraces and camped by the creek. This creek is shown on maps drawn in

1863 and 1865.



A dam once existed in the centre o f The Manly. Kianawah District Board requested loan to enlarge improve and the dam constructed in front of the present

#### RSSAILA Hall.

However, on 8 June 1899, Mr Williams, Assistant Queensland Government Engineer, inspected the dam and reported that the site was not really suitable. In 1908, a letter to the Wynnum Shire Council complained of the dam overflowing after every downpour and causing damage to the lower end of Cambridge Parade. The dam was removed before 1920 and Manly ANZAC Park created in its place.

The bed of the creek can be located today as the large dip in Mountjoy Terrace. The creek arose in Gordon Parade, across the railway station and a small feeder creek joined in from the top of Oakley Terrace. Then, the creek bed continues behind the service station in Yamboyna Street, through the ANZAC Memorial Park, east to the Manly RSSAILA, then north of Cambridge Parade and out


