of 16 November 2006

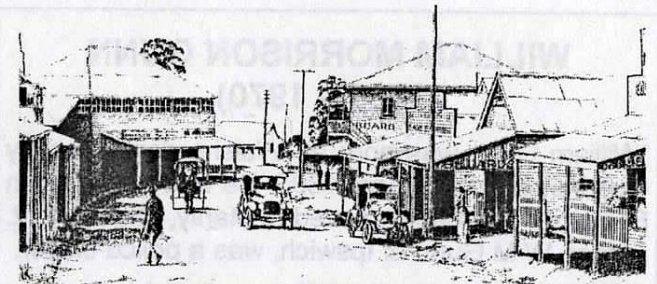

WILLIAM MORRISON GUNN (1895 – 1970)

"William Gunn was born at (Walsherdon), Mackay Queensland on 19 April 1895. He was educated in Brisbane. The family moved to Manly, Qld in 1912. Father, W M Gunn of Ipswich, was a police officer.

With his two brothers, William enlisted in the first world war with the 2nd Australian Light Horse at Gallipoli where he was wounded. After recovering he served in Palestine until 1917.

William married Edith Ann Curtis, daughter of Joseph and Ellen Curtis of Manly on October 29 1921, a daughter member of the well-known Curtis family. They had two children, Morris and Elaine. William was in business in Manly (Grocer?) . The family resided in Kingsley Terrace, Manly.

In April 1944 he entered Queensland Parliament as labour member for Wynnum and retired on 28 May 1966.

William was a tireless worker for the Wynnum Manly district and during his term of office many major improvements occurred in his electorate. He played bowls, being a member of Wynnum Bowling Club and Manly Ring Bowls

He was a kind and compassionate man of integrity and was very much aware of the great virtue of true humility."

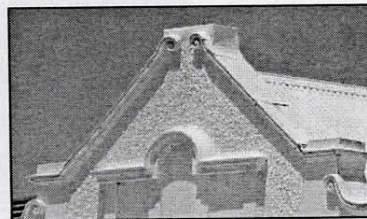


Resource Centre Report January 2007

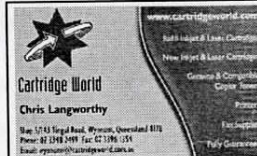

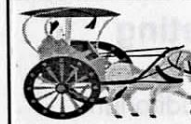
