
The Lucky Door Prize was won by Mavis Wagner, the Raffle by Heather Smith and the Membership Draw by Shirley Jeffries.

The Society would like to thank Peter Cumming and his Community and Parks Development Fund Committee for awarding us a grant to place a plague on the Carron Cannon, which stands outside the Wynnum Library.

This 24-pounder muzzle loading cannon No.60756 was cast at the Carron Foundry, Falkirk, Scotland in 1800 AD, and is one of twelve cannons which arrived in Brisbane on board the migrant ship "Clifton" in May 1862 as a gift from Queen Victoria.

Port of Brisbane and Bundaberg

On 1 October 2007, the Bundaberg Port Authority officially merged with Brisbane Corporation, becoming the Bundaberg Port Corporation P/L -a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Port of Brisbane Corporation.

The decision to merge the two ports was made by the Oueensland Government, to give Bundaberg access to much-needed resources and the expertise of the Brisbane team.

One of the first major projects to commence in Bundaberg will be the construction of a bridge over Burnett Creek (linking the Burnett area to the port), and the construction of approximately 1km of roadway, at the cost of around \$7 million. Construction is planned to commence in early 2008. "Port News Oct 07"
