Main Speaker: Kate Harbison talked of the writers who lived, and had lived, in the local district, in particular the life of John Manifold.

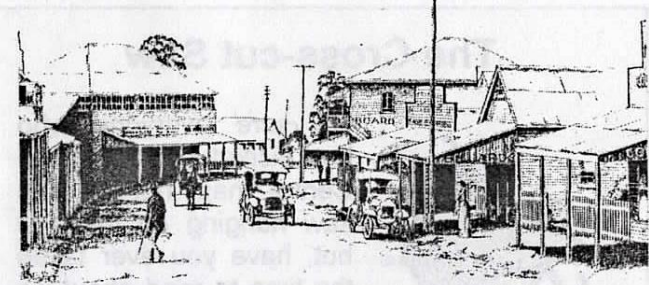

The Cross-cut Saw



I'm sure everyone who has visited our Resource Centre has noticed the saw hanging on the wall but, have you ever taken the time to read about it's history?

This "one-man" crosscut saw is of historical significance as an example of one of the tools used by early settlers in Australia. The date of manufacture of this particular saw is unknown but certainly was pre-1900. The original owner and user was Johannas Naumann, whose parents emigrated to Australia from Germany. Johannas Naumann farmed land at Templin (via Boonah) in the Fassifern District and this saw would have been a basic tool used in the clearing and fencing of his land.

Subsequently the saw passed into the ownership of his son, Stanley Naumann who became a Baker and Pastry cook. He used the saw for tree felling and processing the firewood for his bakery ovens, first at Gunalda (via Gympie) and later at MacDonald Street, Lota (1945 – 1964). A unique exhibit, still in excellent condition, the saw is a hands-on reminder of the 19th century life in southern Queensland.

The saw comes to the Wynnum Manly Historical Society from Stanley Naumann's daughter Mrs Janice Winks (nee Naumann). The representations of the "Shire Clerk's Cottage", "Lota House" and "Early Manly" were painted by Mary Brady.

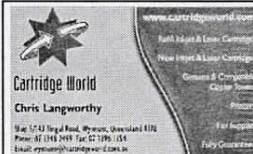
Christmas/New Year

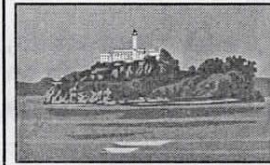


Heritage Tour
