The Lucky Door Prize was won by Joy Jones and the Membership Draw was won by Beryl Kennedy.


Meeting closed at 9.00 and members and guests retired to a delicious supper prepared by Noela Stratton, Peg Borg and Gwen Gilshenan.

Former Firefighter to be recognised with new Wynnum Fire Station



According to a report by the Queensland Fire and Rescue Service, Wynnum's new fire station, which is nearing completion, is being built on land previously owned by former firefighter Sydney Brown.

"Mr Brown was fatally injured during a blaze at the Star Picture Theatre on Tingal Road, Wynnum, in 1959.

In memory of Mr Brown and his contribution to the local fire service, his memory will be honoured with a plaque to be attached to the station when it is completed.

Family members of Mr Brown will be invited to unveil the plaque at the official opening..."

"Wynnum's new \$1.43 million fire station will be at 288 Wynnum Road. Building work on the new station began in August 2003, with Springwood company Shailer Constructions winning the construction contract.

The new station will replace the existing station in Mountjoy Terrace – which was built in 1938 – and is the second oldest in Brisbane."
