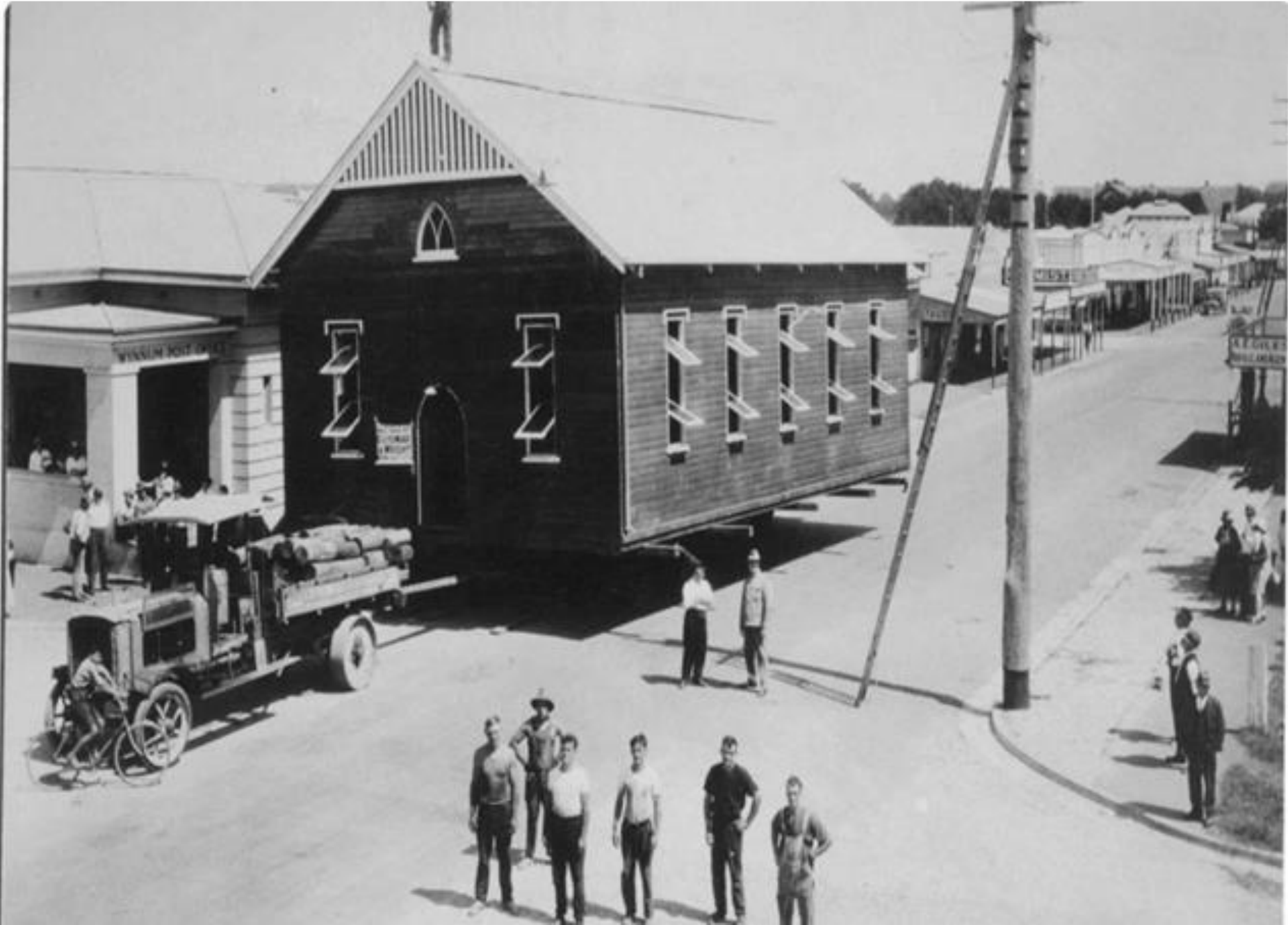

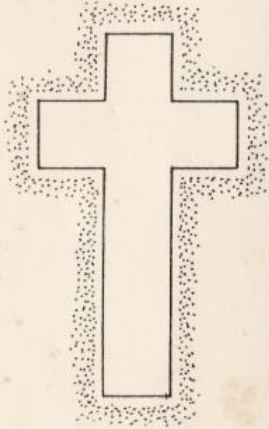

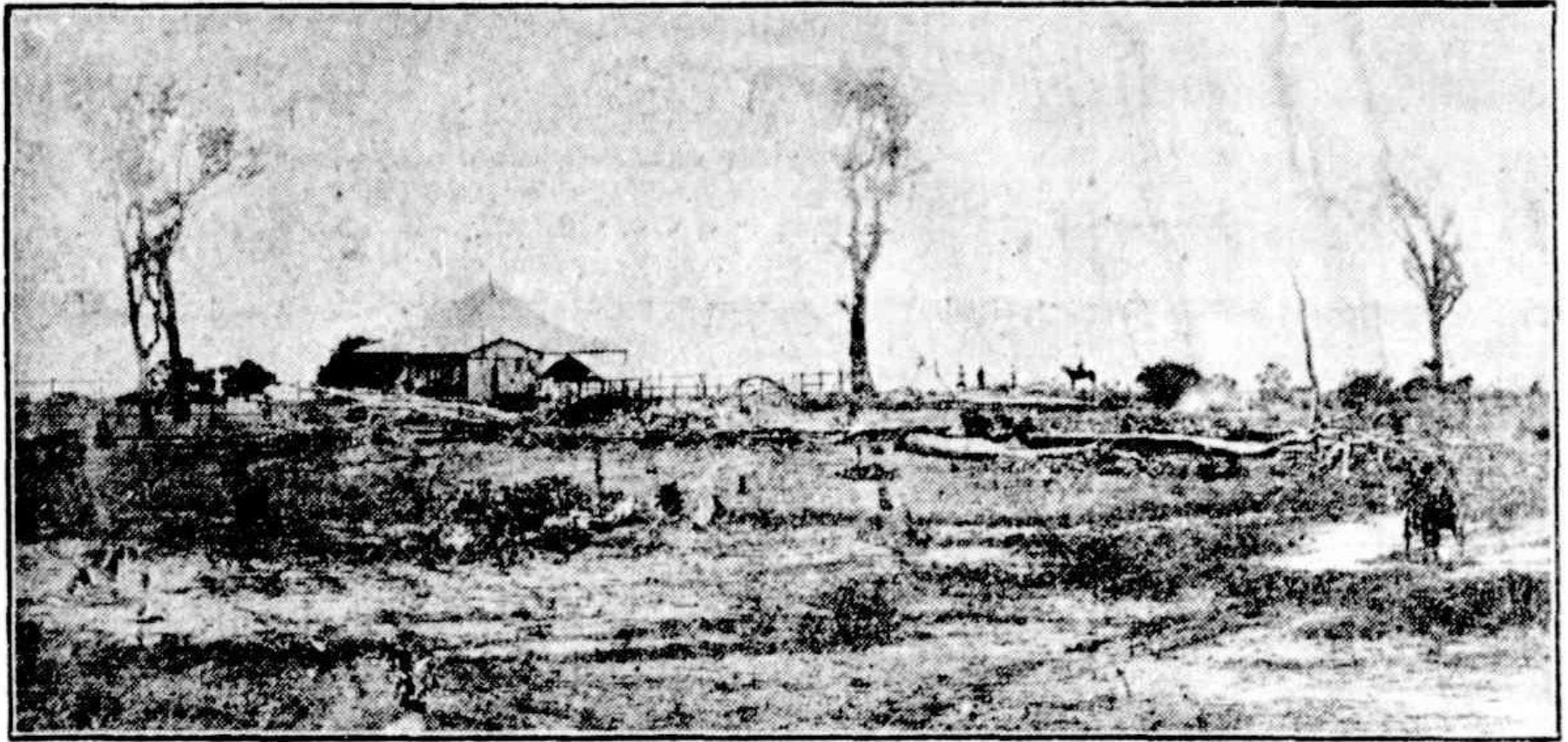

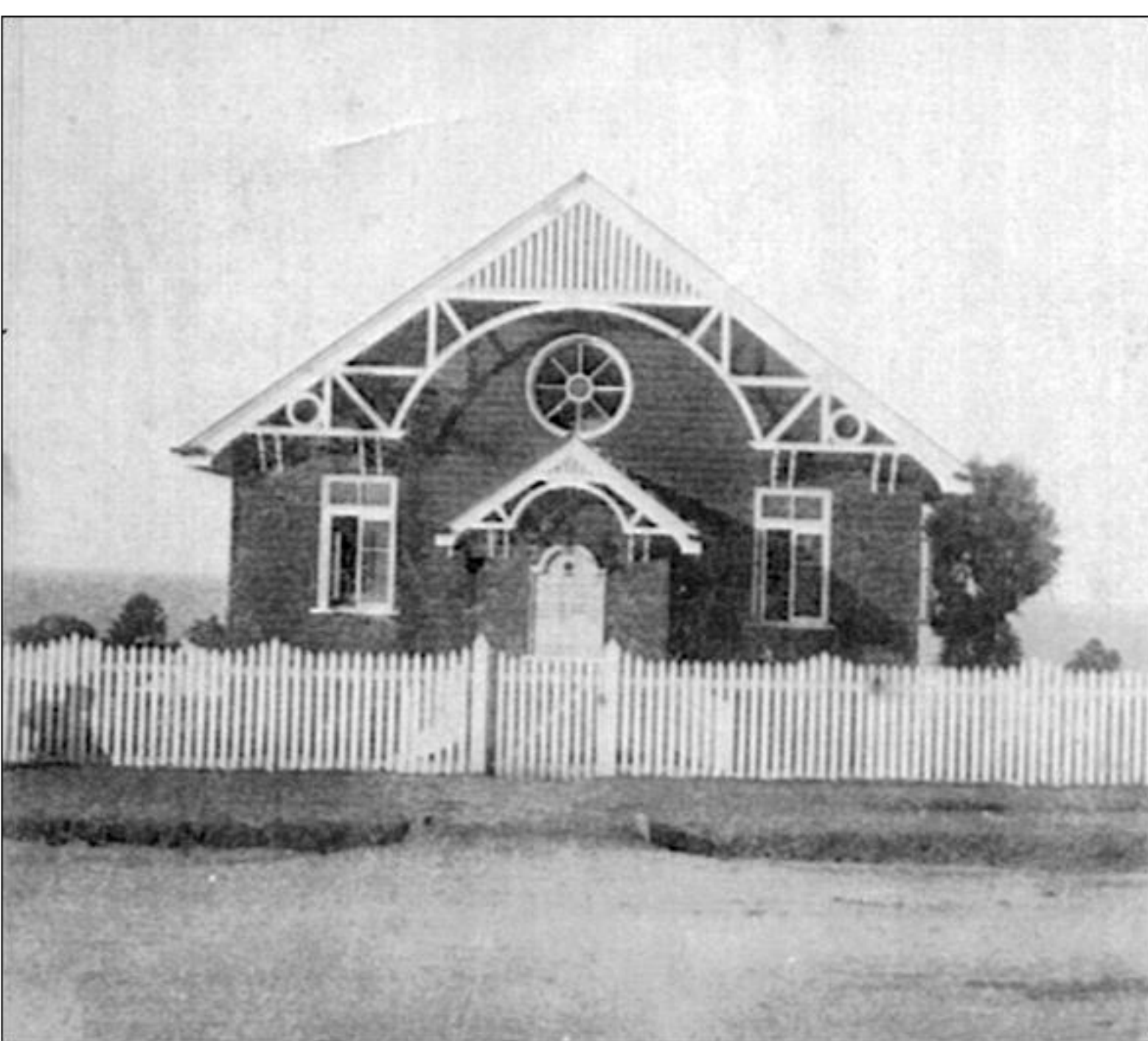

Buildings - Churches - Bay Terrace, seaward side between Cedar and Walnut Streets – Presbyterian Church, est. 1896 in a building in Chestnut Street, attached to Bulimba Parish until 1908 – was fully sanctioned and became a separate charge in 1913 – Chestnut property sold in 1918 and site at corner of Bay Terrace and Walnut Street purchased – Church and manse erected two years later and served the congregation till 1960 when the new brick building on Corner Bay and Cedar Streets was finished.

Events - The Shows - Bay Terrace – School of Arts – this appears to be the winning entrants in the baking competition in the Wynnum Presbyterian fete – Decorations have all been carefully made out of crepe paper and fernery – The board behind the women infers that a lodge met in the School of Arts building – there were a variety of these lodges, one of which was the Masonic Moreton Lodge which met here from 1917 to 1921 – Masonic Temple was dedicated in 1921 - see Back to Wynnum Book 1933.

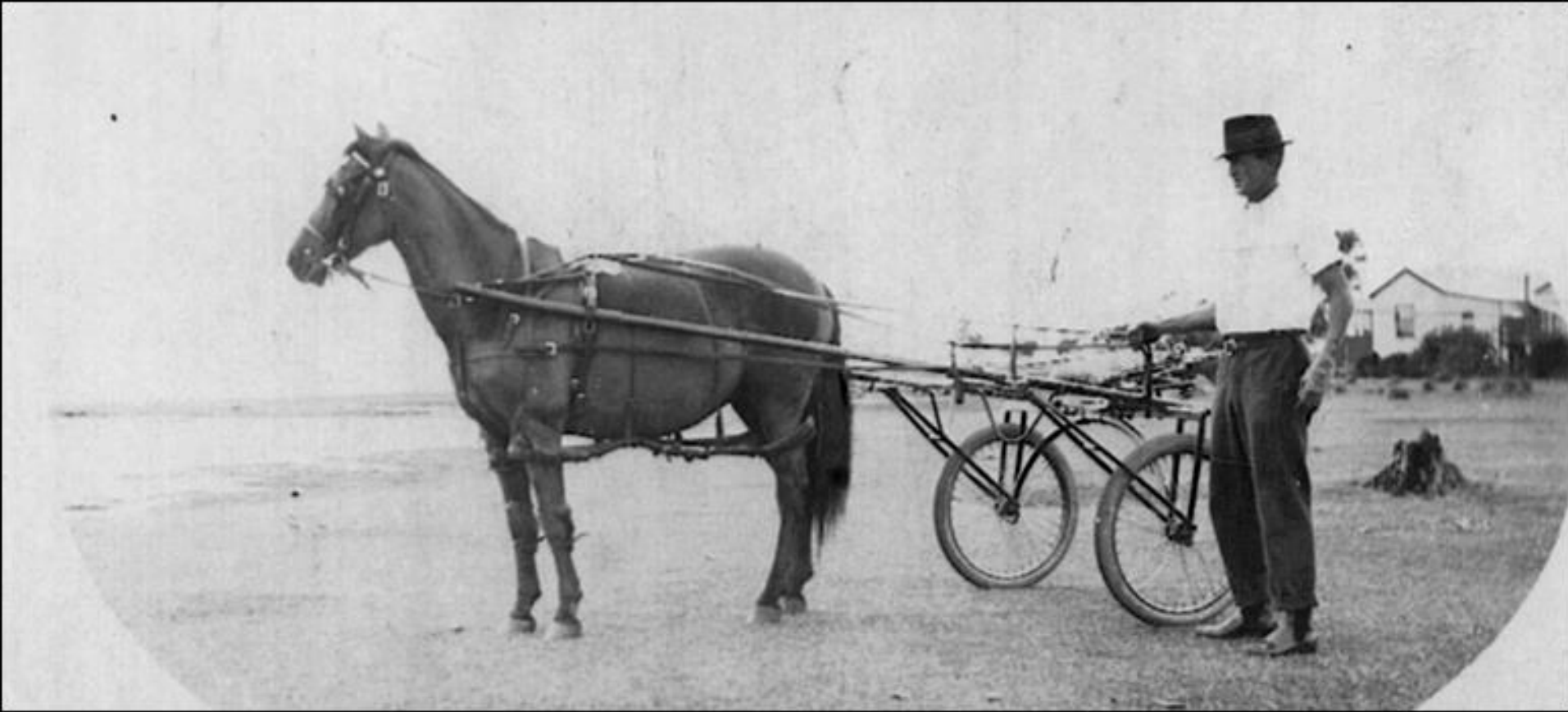

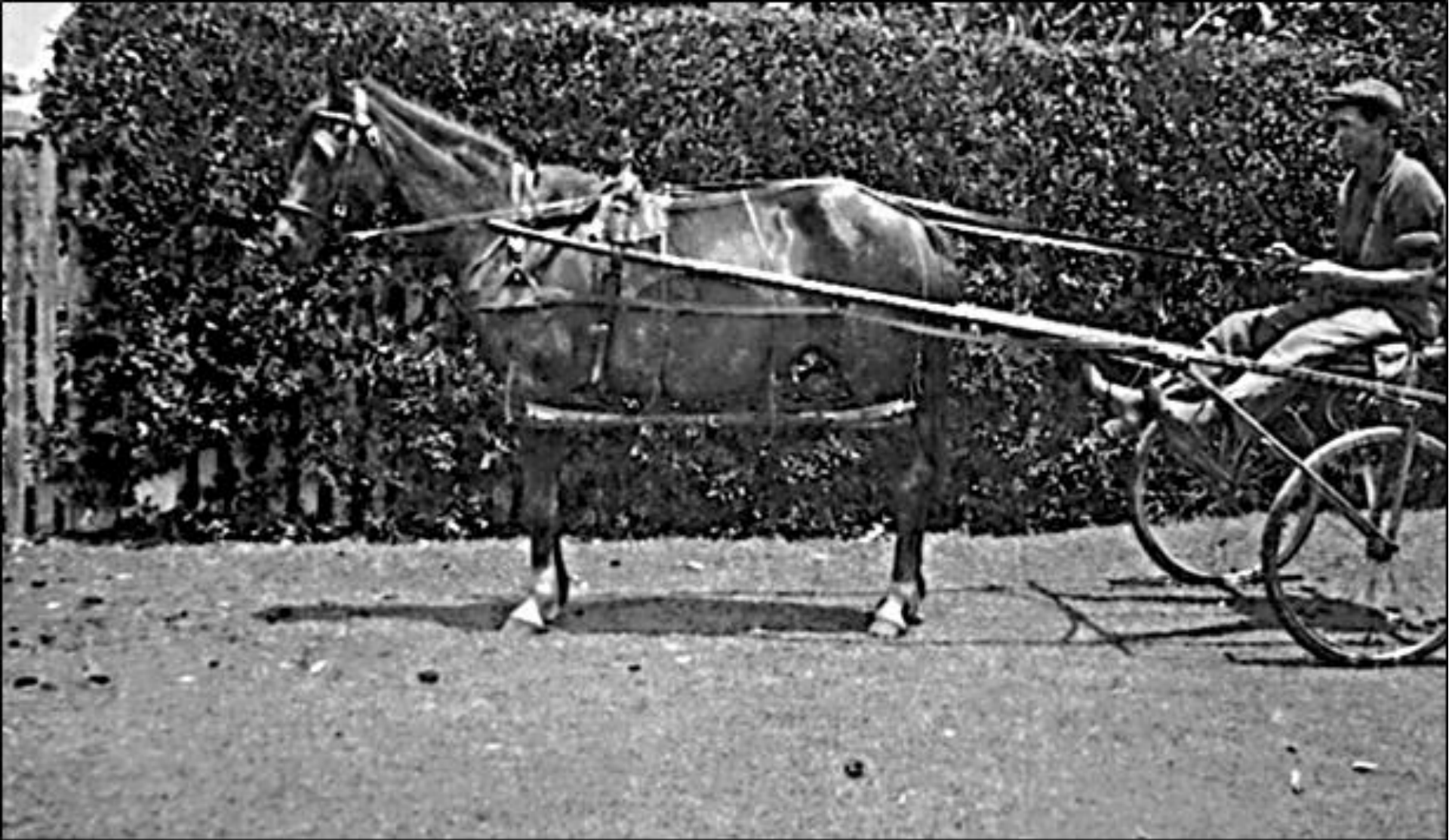

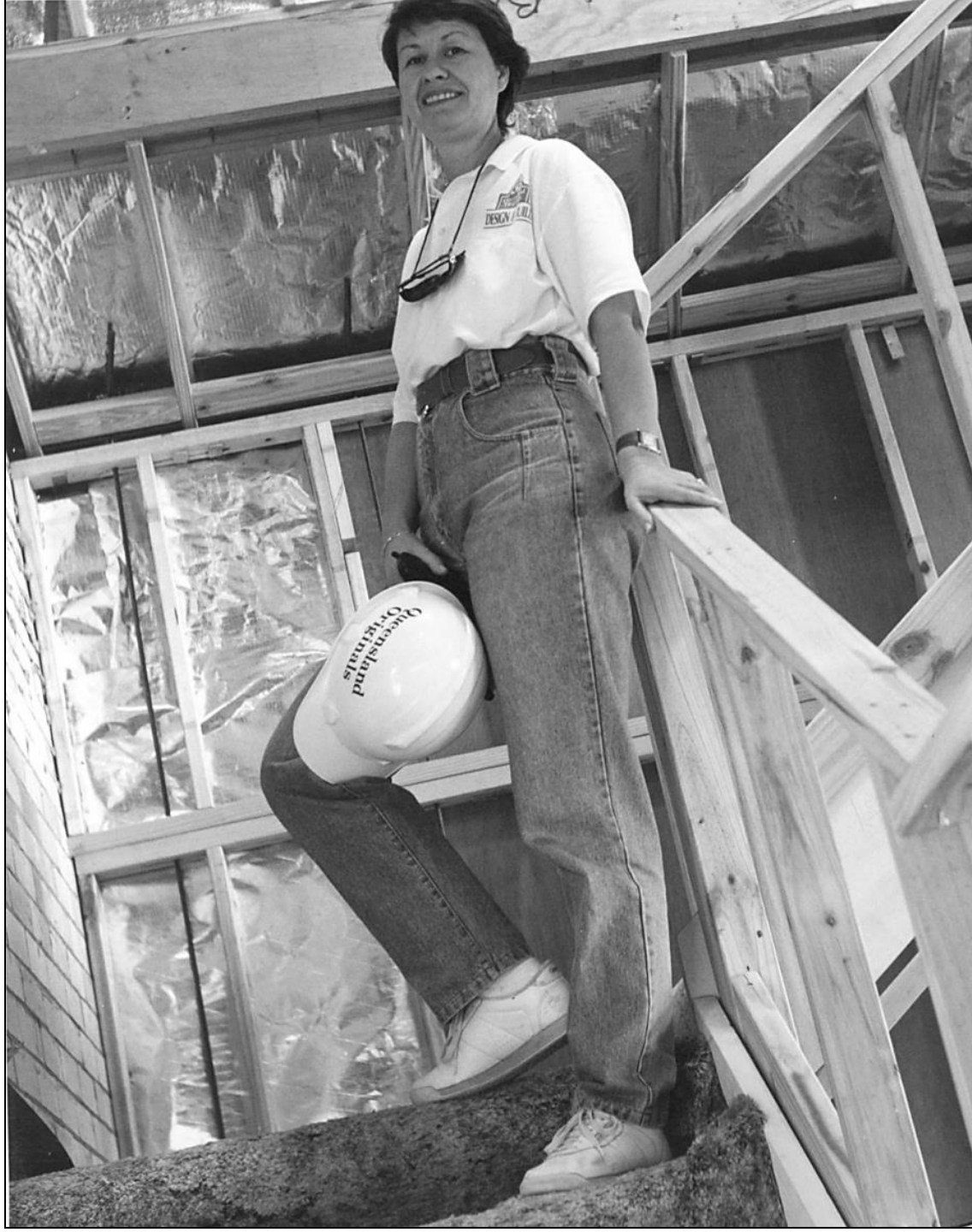


Wynnum Photo No 348 **Characters** - Daphne Raymond: Daphne's drama - from the early age of 17 - playing in vaudeville shows during the war - Daphne has performed an active role in the theatre - Daphne was on the first committee which established the Mercury Theatre in Wynnum in 1949. She became director in 1953 and continued for thirty years - very much involved in the Mercury Childrens' Theatre, Daphne's sense of humour is her greatest asset - she may work with over forty children each year - in 1970 she received the British Empire Medel for services to the Community from the Queen on the Ship Britannica - she is the convenor for the Wynnum Eisteddfod's speech and drama section and has to cope with more than 1,700 entrances annually - as an actress some of her more memorable roles include: A nun in "Seven Nuns in Las Vegas" (which won her best actress at Warana in the 1960s. Characters - Dell Buckby : Ready to go - “My first introduction to drag racing was when my boyfriend (later husband) took me on our first date to the drag racing at Surfer’s Paradise in 1974 – fell in love with the spectacular cars, the sounds, the tyre smoke and the incredible speeds. – since that Dell has been a successful drag racing competitor – while practising at Willowbank in their V8 altered, which had clocked in at 9.6 seconds at 220 kph over the quarter mile, Dell had a major accident and was lucky to emerge alive – the car was a complete write off – after much sweat and tears, Dell is back – pictured here in their new altered, Dell and her husband are hopeful of breaking into the eight second barrier at 250 kph and once again being in the winner’s circle

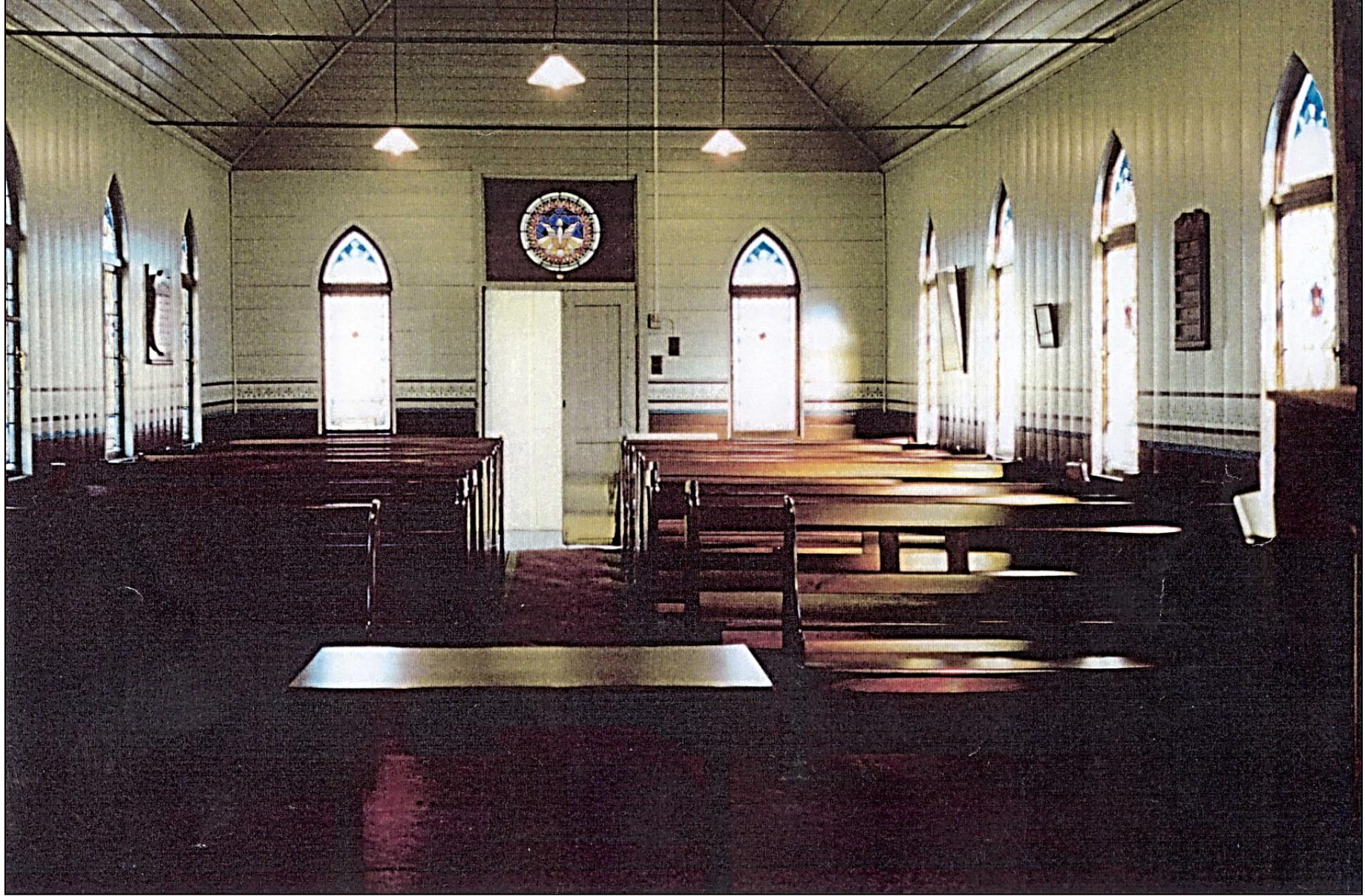

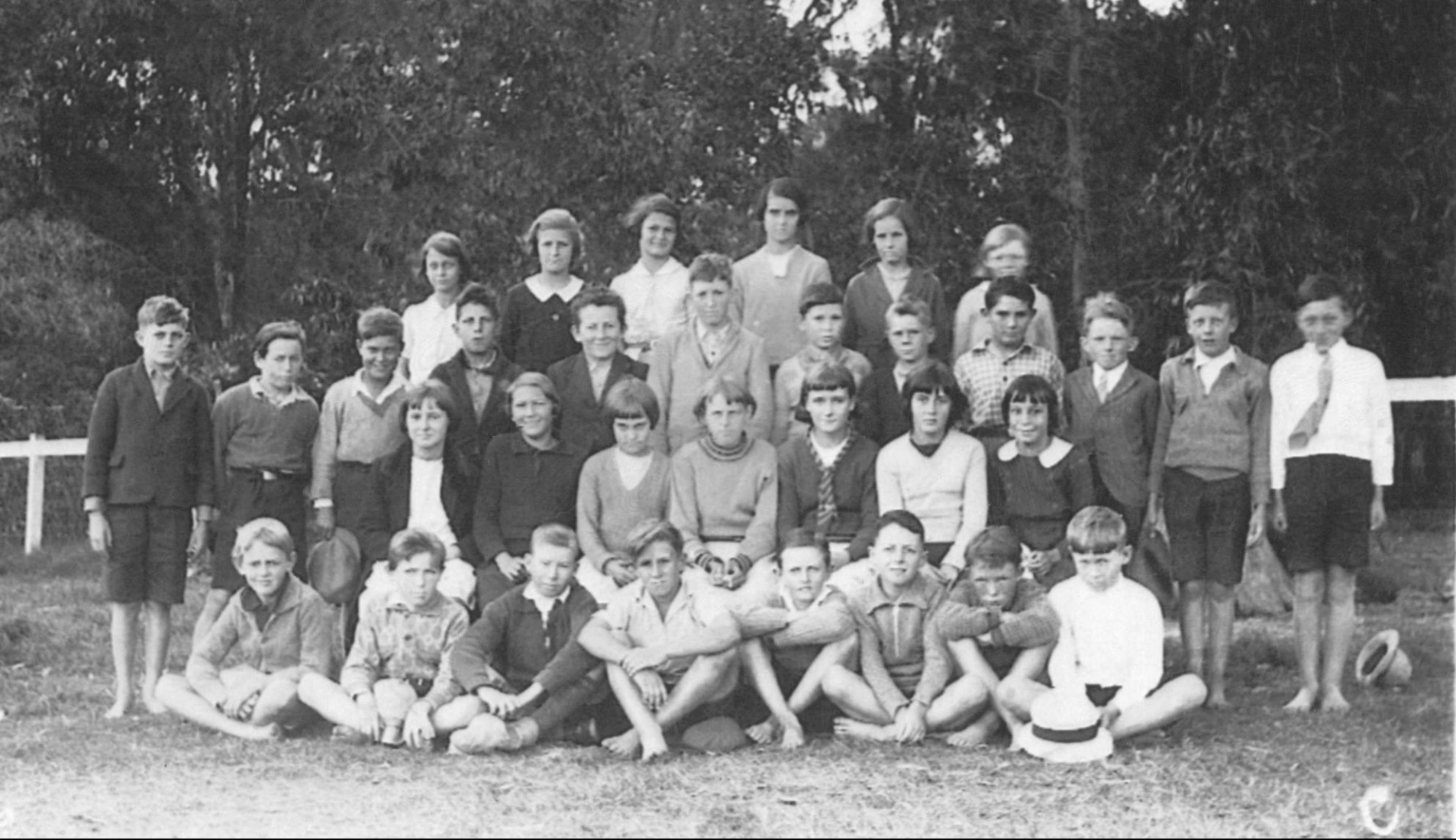

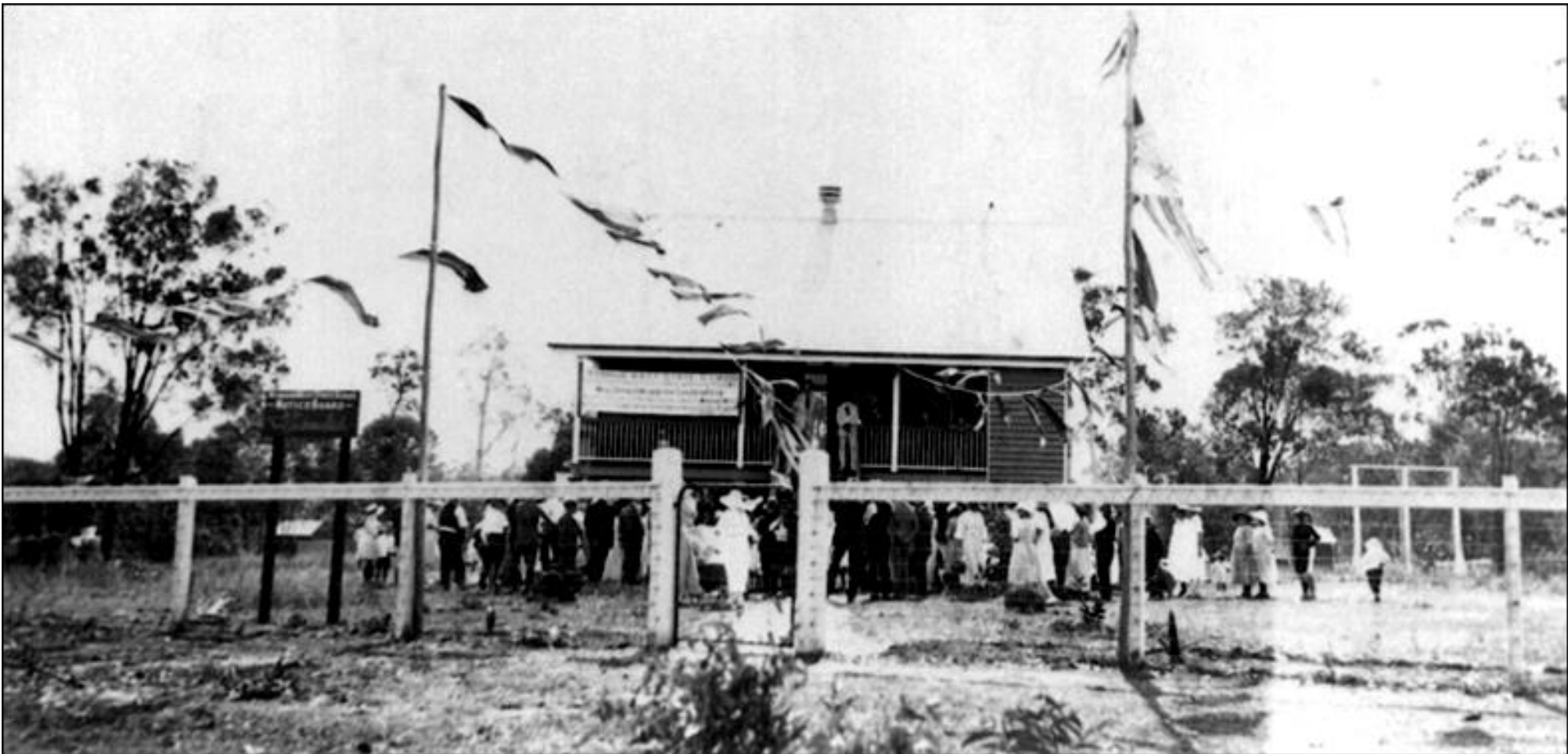
